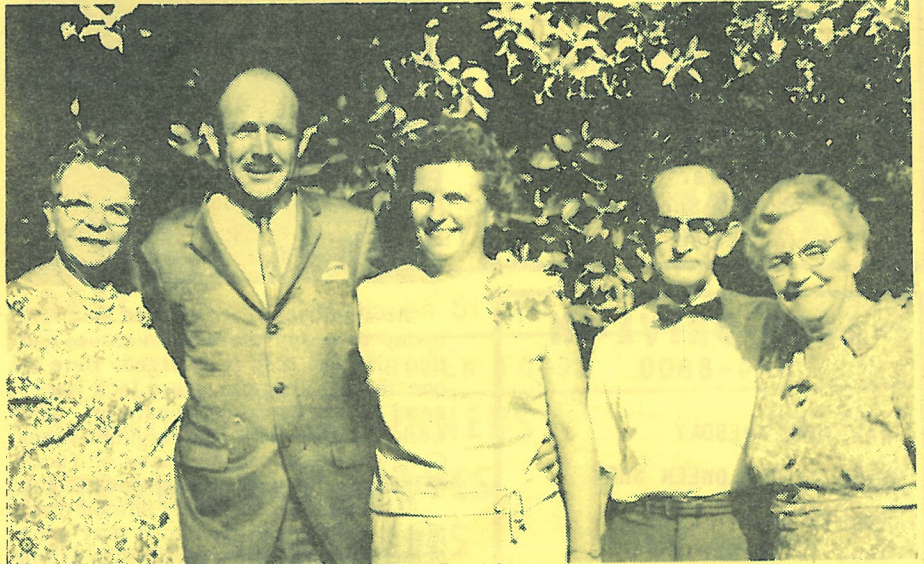
COWS WRECK CARS!

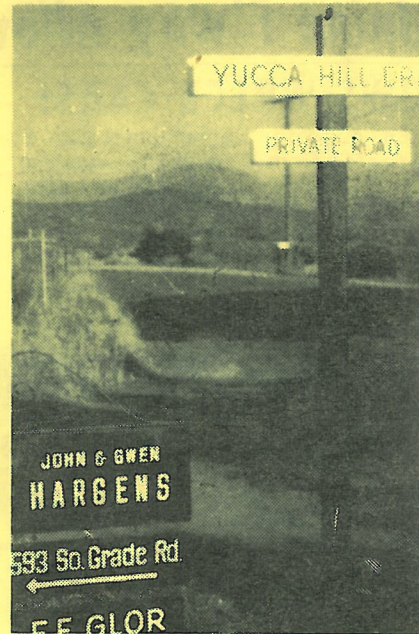

SCHOOL MAY GET US CASH

Alpine Elementary School may get \$5,558.74 if it joins the federal program to aid children of low-income families, says W.C. Riles, acting state director of compensatory education. A provision is that the project suggested by the school must be approved by the state board of education.

This program is called for in the act of 1965, signed by President Johnson on April 11 and founded last month. A district's share depends on its number of 5-17 year olds from families earning less than \$2,000, yearly, or those above this level who get aid for dependent children.

BAD CREST FIRE

The worst brush fire in many years in the back country last Thursday took a toll of nine homes, three cars, four men injured and a kennel of 40 pups.

Federal, state and community firemen worked through the night, Friday and Saturday morning to get the blaze out. Several pieces went from here, with others from the Canyon and nearby places. All did a fine job.

Former Crest Fire Chief George Behrens, had bad burns on his right hand. Capt. John W. Dyer, of the Crest Volunteers is in Navy Hospital with severe burns on 75% of his body.

The huge blaze, seen by thousands from all over the South County, was the worst in many years. Only two weeks ago Alpine had a bad fire. Several others were fought around the county, the Santa Ana condition aiding the flames.

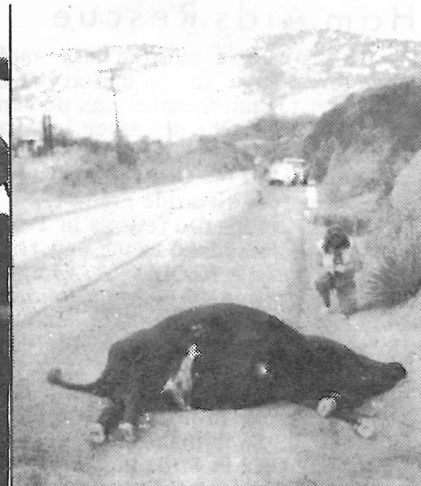
COWS WRECK CARS From I

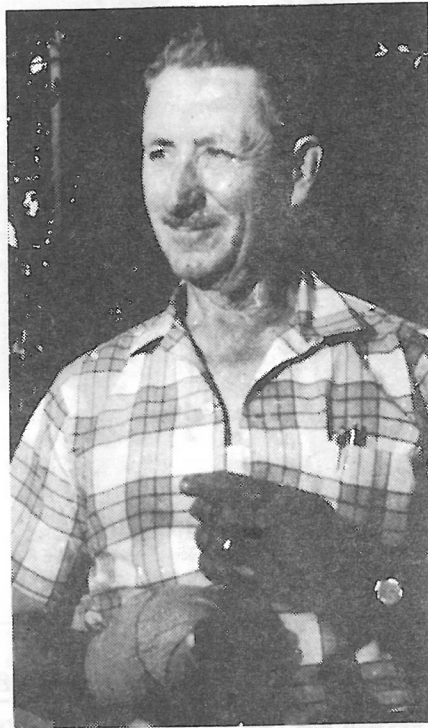
