The Veteran is Really Something Special

Yesterday America paused to observe a national holiday, Veterans' Day, to honor those who served in all wars.

It was a sad day for many-- Gold Star Mothers, thousands of boys in hospitals, and many Americans who grieved that their great General and former President Dwight D. Eisenhower was in the hospital.

It has been a tendency of late to look down a bit on veterans, nibbling at their benefits and asking "what is so special about a veteran?"

"The veteran is something special. He became something special the moment he slipped into his uniform", is what Andy Borg, new Commander-in-Chief of the VFW, said at its 66th National Convention recently.

Borg, a Superior, Wisc., attorney, added that "The fact that he (the veteran) was selected made him something special and put him in a class by himself. He was committed to fight to the death for the ideals of freedom around the world".

He also made it clear that "only the best physically, mentally and morally are called to war; hence only the best are a special breed-- the elite. The tragedy of war is that only the best are fit to be killed or disabled".

The new VFW chief blamed such attacks on veterans' rights on "the social planners and Budget Bureau economizers" who want to free VA funds to finance other new and expanding federal programs.

One day not too far off there will be no more Veterans of WW1, WW2, or Korea, and America will still enjoy its freedoms, the promise of survival and a greater life, because they laid down their lives for their beloved country. Look around you and show appreciation of your fighting men!- CI (USN WW1).

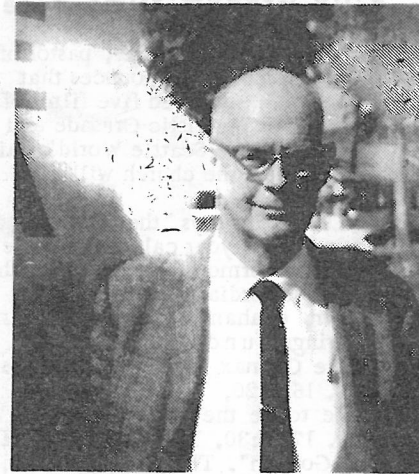

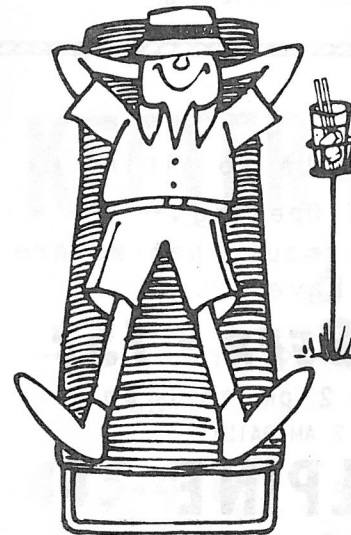

Carl McCall Realty has just been reorganized and has legally adopted the name Alpine Realty Co., with Carl



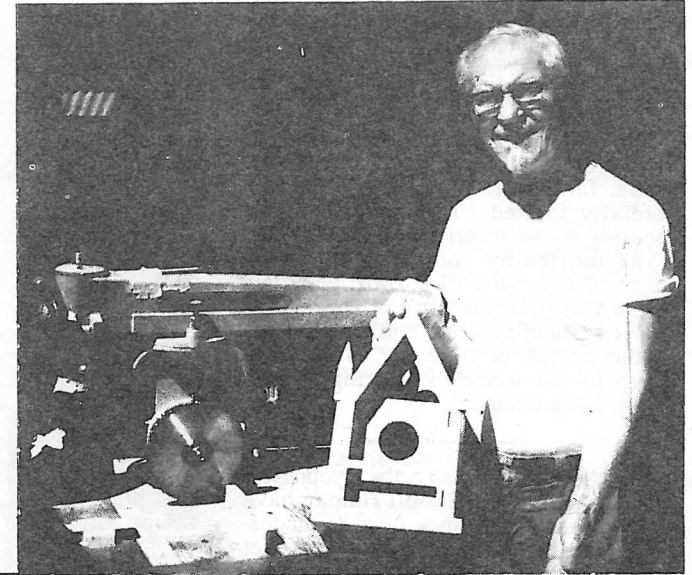

He says "even if you continue working, your application will establish your eligibility for hospital insurance under the new "Medicare" program. "The application gives you an opportunity to enroll in the voluntary medical insurance plan, which helps pay doctor bills and the costs of certain other medical services. You can have this important added protection at a low cost (\$3. monthly) because the Federal Government will pay an equal amount toward the cost.

If you will be 65 or over on Jan 1, 1966, you should not wait to enroll for medical insurance. To have this protection when the program starts on July 1 you must enroll before March 31, 1966.
