Newspapers Show Growth of Communities.

Shortly after we sold Let's Live!, which we founded and edited in Hollywood, 1933-1949, and came to Alpine, which I had selected back in 1937 after searching from Oregon to Mexico and east to the Sierras, we started the Sun, 14 years ago this month.

In driving around the country visiting friends and newspaper folk, we concluded that Poway, then a mere crossroads with a tiny postoffice and a few residents, would eventuate into a part of greater SD, which time has proved correct.

After we started the Sun, an old friend from LA, Leo De Moulin, came up to see our "operation", offset. He had been a letter press or hot type printing instructor, retired to Poway, wanted to start a paper. We showed him the entire operation whereupon he bought a similar outfit, started the Poway News.

It eventuated into the present News-Chieftain, run by a graduate journalist and friendly colleague, D. Van Quackenbush. Likewise he had come to see our plant prior to starting the Del Mar Surfcomber, launched it also in Offset, later sold out, went to Poway.

Which brings us to the theme for this editorial. Last week he ran an editorial: "With this issue, as you can plainly see, the 'little paper' has become a full-size, 8-column paper, It's still the content, or what's in a paper that makes it worth while or not. And in 1966 we have resolved to print more news and more pictures. We did that in 1965, then we printed nearly one-fourth more news and photos than in the previous year.

"(It's local news coverage & photos which keep weekly newspapers around the house all week -- which, in fact, have made weekly newspapers the best advertising medium in America.)

"Yes, we're growing--but our growth is reflective of a growing Poway and Rancho Bernardo."

So we congratulate "Van" and his good wife on the growth of their paper. and we also shall run more news and photos, and by the same token, our growth is reflective of a growing


