Oldtimers at the dedication of Leger Memorial Auditorium at Harbison Canyon School, part of Alpine's district, were thrilled with the fine new \$84,000. building with its nice auditorium.

It recalled the days when the only meeting hall was in the Woman's Club which is still in use, but was eclipsed when the new school was completed with its large auditorium, used jointly as a cafeteria.

In those days the town had about 1700 population. Today it is nearly 4000, officially 3557 at last count, but many have moved in since then. With the freeway, new apartments and other structures on the drawing board, this community will someday be needing a still larger hall for events that will be planned.

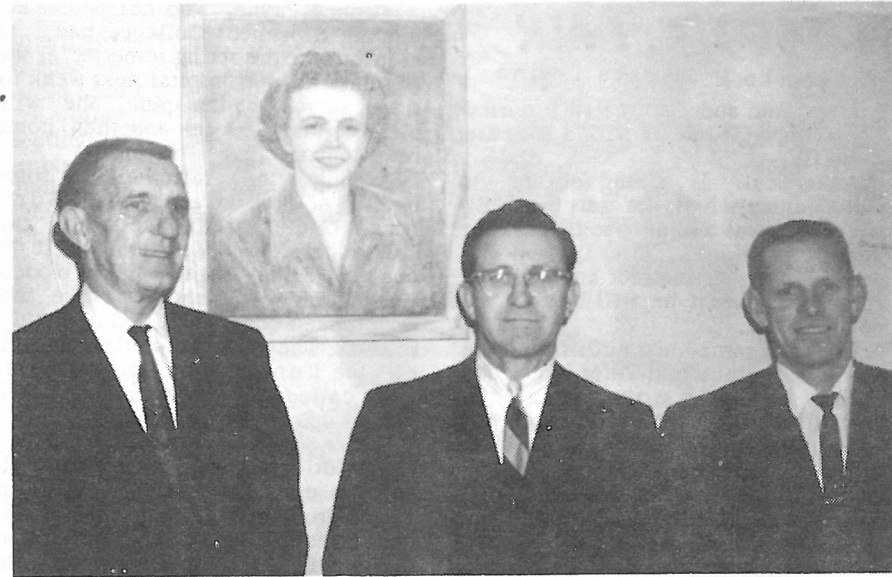
HORSESHOES FOR JOLLY SENIORS

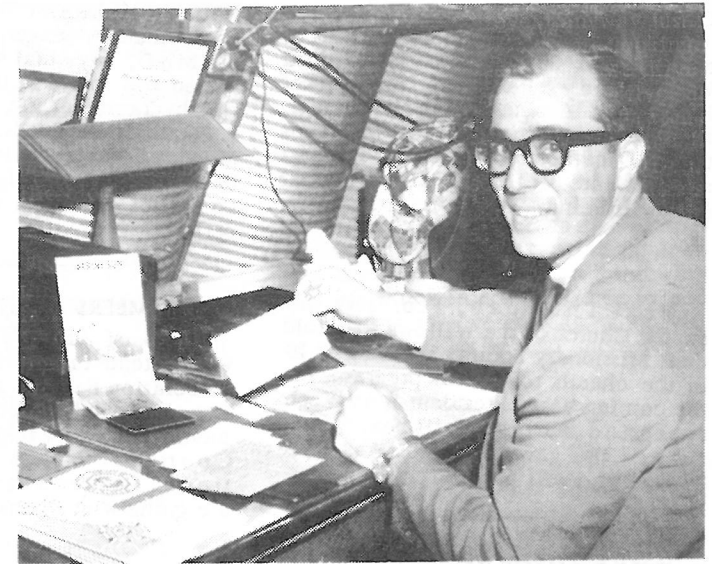
