Is Alpine Preparing for Freeway Changes?

A serious situation is confronting Alpine. It has happened to many communities when freeways have been built alongside busy downtown areas. Every town thus affected has registered an immediate drop in business revenue when traffic was diverted.

What is Alpine doing about this coming adjustment, this inevitable sluicing of business away from its downtown area? Local merchants must

face this adjustment at the end of next year. Certain lines will feel the hardship of diminishing income. Service stations, motels, cafes will be the main ones hit.

But in the future this town will be a finer, quieter, even busier one than it is today, for people will come here to live and to shop and to enjoy the friendliness of our merchants.

The highway office reports that the drop is soon forgotten with the buildup of local business, and that within about 1½ years things return to normal. We hope it will repeat in Alpine.

With the building of new apartments, which have been already rented, and the improvement of other groups of cottages, and the building of new homes, this community should not suffer too long.

But it might be well for businessmen to get together to plan some sort of promotion to help increase business and bring more solid residents here. One good way is to support your local newspaper, and the Sun is just that, edited, published and printed right here. It is working at all times for the betterment of your town; it is your newspaper. And it believes the freeway will eventually be a vast improvement for this town. - CI

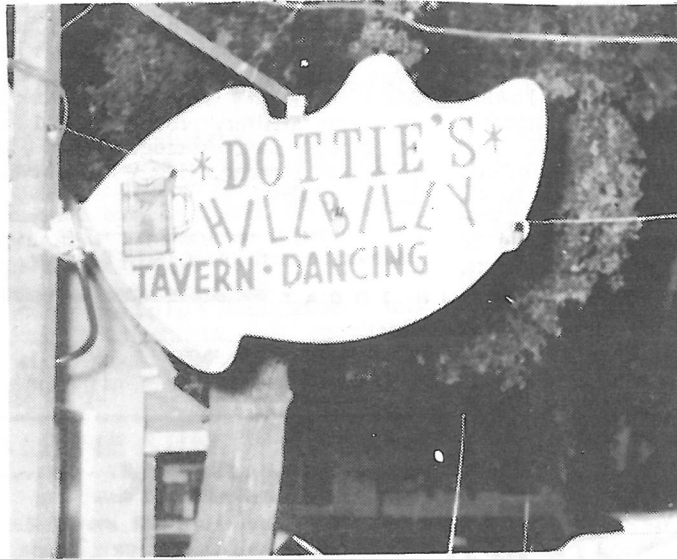

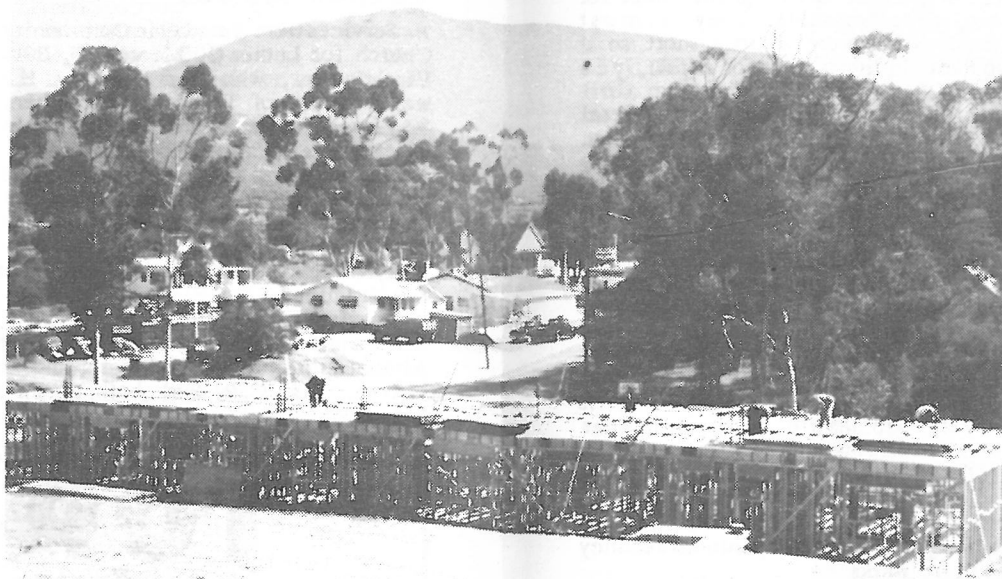


NEW OWNER FOR CANDY HOUSE

Dr. and Mrs. Frank Bornowski are mourning the death of their little brown dog named Phoebe. She was their constant companion when they went for walks.

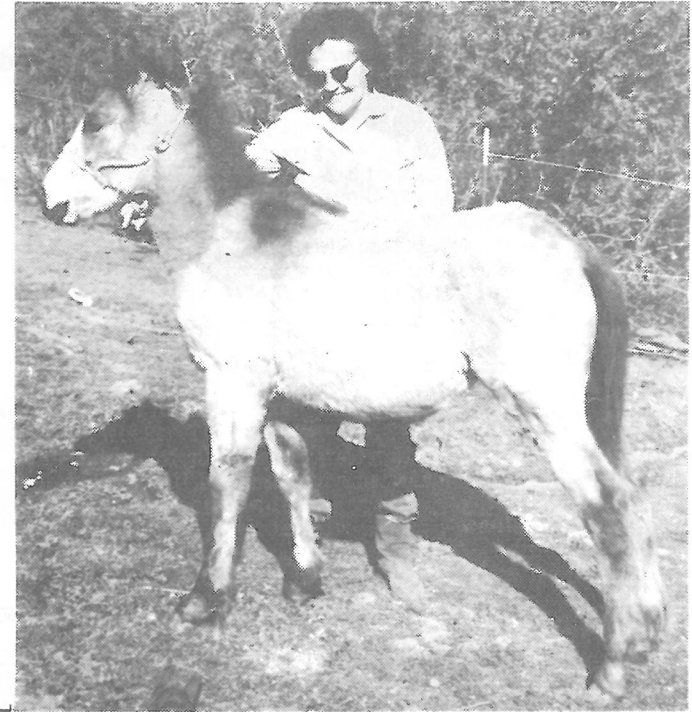
