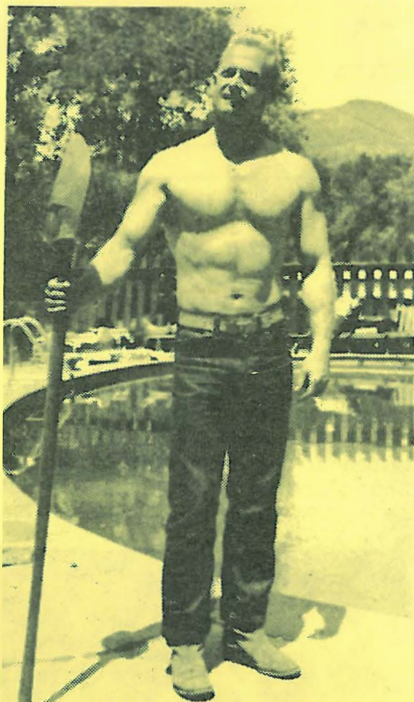

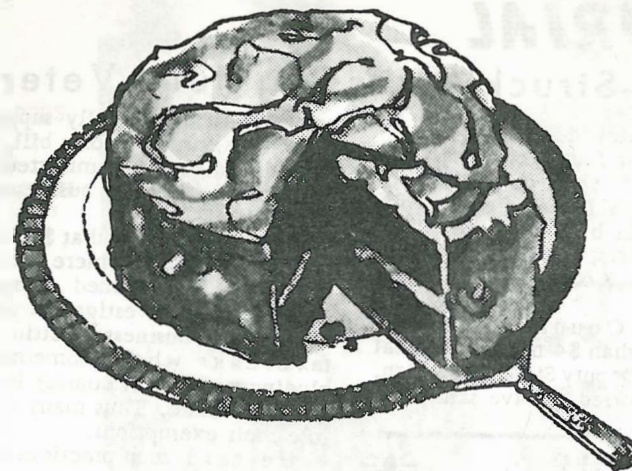

EDITORIAL



Scandal-Struck Assessing Hurts Veterans.

The recent statewide assessor scandals that brought four grand jury investigations and the conviction of Alameda County's Donald Feragan for taking \$16,455 in bribes, not only cheats all taxpayers, but hurts Veterans of WW1, WW2, Korea, and other servicemen.

The Kern County Land Co., "escapes" more than \$4 million in local property taxes, Deputy State Atty. Gen. S. Mayer is reported to have said at a

news conference to rally support for a wide tax assessing reform bill, now installed in a Senate committee. It is said to be frozen by businessmen and assessors.

Mayer pointed out that \$1500 an acre land is assessed at a mere \$60 an acre, to the above mentioned company. He also said their investigation yielded 13 examples of businesses getting property tax breaks where homeowners (including veterans of course) had to pay their full share. Thus many veterans lose their exemptions.

He said such practices are widespread throughout the state and that "those who have been getting the brakes want to keep on getting those breaks".

It seems that the right thing to do would be to get the Board of Equalization to get on the job and "equalize" these assessments--taking from the rich tax evaders and bribers, and giving it to the poor little overloaded taxpayer, among whom are many veterans that gave up bright prospects when President Wilson, FDR, or Truman asked them to forsake their future and fight America's battles.

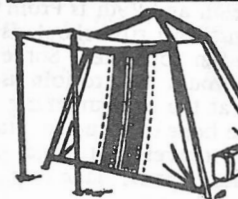

Create New Homesites

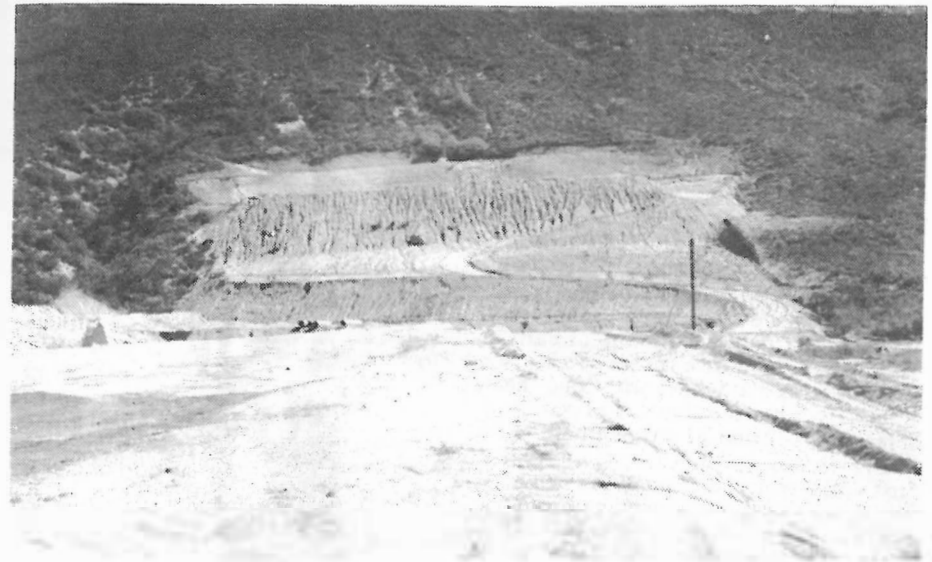

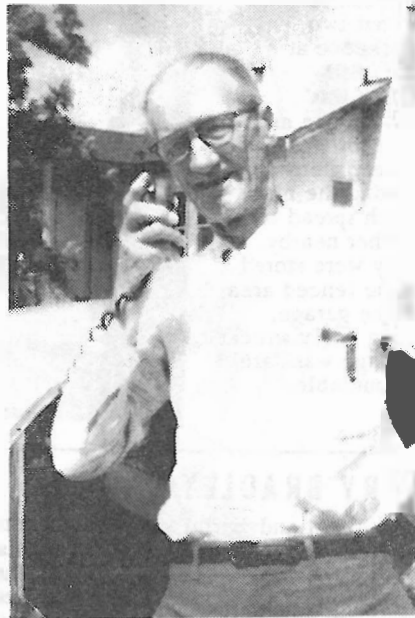

SUN TAKES LEGAL NOTICES

There are drawbacks if your firm, where the name of owner or partners, does not show, which state code requires to be filed then advertised in a legal newspaper for four weeks. 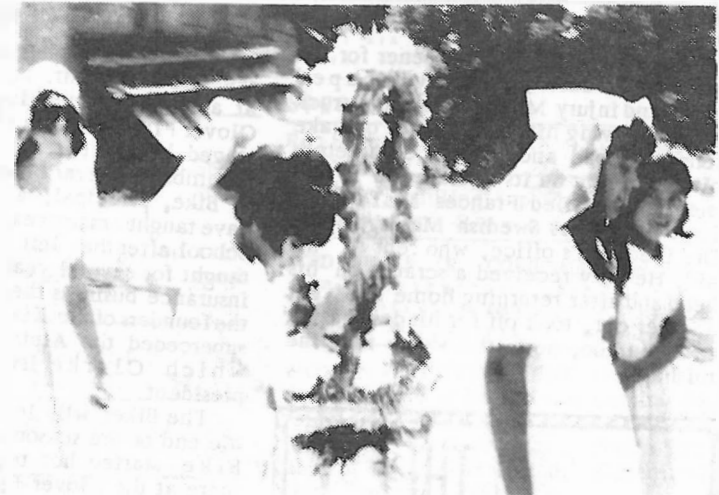
