EDITORIAL



Tight Money in Wrong Place Hurts Nation

The entire US is suffering from a slackening of almost every business due to the government's raising interest rates which was followed by banks, building and loan firms and loan companies.

The most damaging phase is in the building area including sales of new and used dwellings. This month Western Real Estate News & Investor ran a letter it wrote to the President, with the answer, an interesting piece of reading.

The magazine told how an employed young man with wife and three children, in a suburban town, tried to get a loan for a new home. "He was doing what most American breadwinners yearn to do-- provide the best possible shelter for those people whom he loves", it stated.

Due to tight money, he was turned down, but he was able to go into any

discount store, get as much credit as needed to buy luxuries at TV, golf clubs, power mower and so on.

"There is something quite terrifying about an economy that permits you to buy luxury items on credit, but which denies credit for better housing-- and I am sure we both agree, that the home is the heart of America", it concluded.

The answer was from Gardner Ackley, chairman of the Council on Economic Advisors, Washington, who said that some degree of credit restraint is, unfortunately, required in order to counter the threat of general inflation.

"Deferring some home purchases seems preferable, however, to accepting the greater threat of spiraling price increases which are highly inequitable and have a distorting effect on the economy", Ackley wrote.

The editor then noted: "Nothing is important to the continuing well being of this country as the ability to purchase better housing. A man's home is his castle. What he puts in his garage, because money is available, is sometimes sheer nonsense".

MOTORCYCLISTS PICNIC

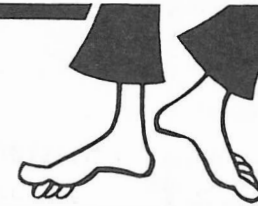

Thursday night when we got back from the show we started to fill our pool and the next day the water was high enough for us to go swimming and

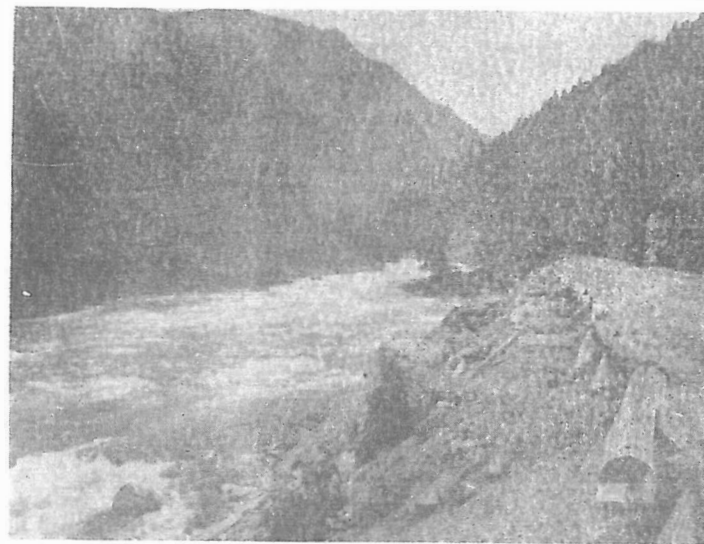

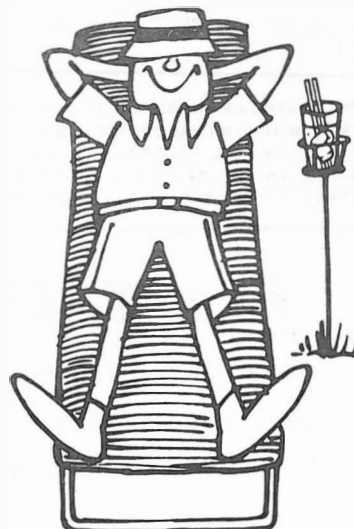
