## Carriso Gorge Excursion Idea Sidetracked

Undoubtedly one of the most spectacular sights in the world is the famous but seldom seen Carriso Gorge above Jacumba.

We were like many other San Diego county folks, pained to learn this week that the idea of a group of prominent San Diegans whose idea is to start excursions, was derailed by the SD & Eastern Arizona railway, owners and operators. The scenic section is perched on 14 trestle and goes through 17 tunnels while descending the gorge from the high point of 3660 ft. to below sea level on the Imperial Valley floor.

This unusual railroad cost \$4 million to build by John D. Spreckles, was opened in 1919, took twelve years to build. One of the trestles, the highest wooden railway bridge in the world, supplanted the first tunnel which col-

lapsed under falling rock. Wood for the trestle came down the coast on rafts, carried in to the dangerous area by mules.

I have always wanted to go over this line myself, the nearest to that was a rather thrilling flight I made through the gorge taking pictures, so I have some idea of the magnitude, beauty and thrilling views that a passenger might enjoy.

I believe this could be made into a world-famous scenic spot and would attract a large tourist business. Robert A. Bowden said the group will make one more effort to get the railroad to allow an excursion before seeking rulings from the Public Utilities Commission and the State Resources Agency.

The Southern Pacific Railway which owns the SD & EA claims the cost of even one run would be prohibitive, but we believe it would eventually be an asset to the railway as well as to the county and California. -CI

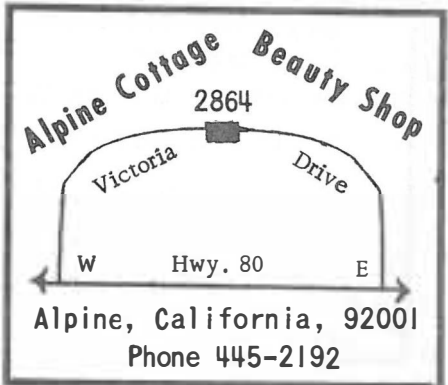

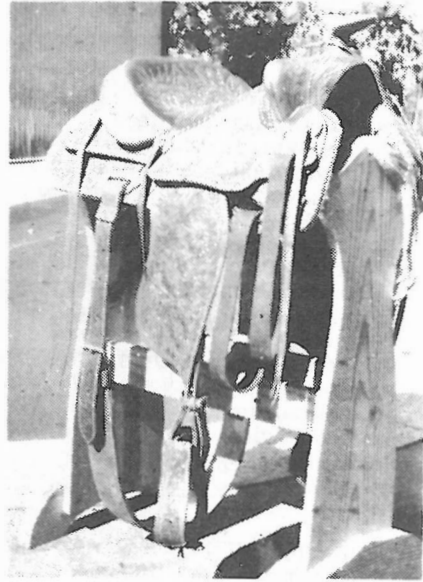

**WISTERIA BLOOMS ENTRANCING**

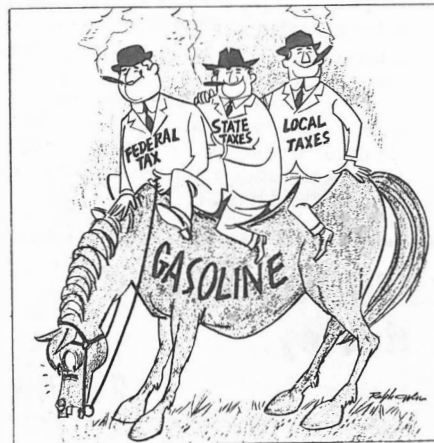

**GARLIC - THE SOCIAL OFFENDER**

The innocent looking little bulb that people shy away from seems to be one of the "kings" of our natural foods. A native of Asia and Egypt and now naturalized in Europe and America, the garlic has held its head high making an impression on people through the ages-- both with its scent and its seeming curative qualities.

From the German Pharmaceutical magazine for Feb. 1, 1950 we learn that "modern physicians have found and have reported that patients placed on garlic dosage speak of a feeling of general well-being and increased vitality after a short time. This possibility may result from the ability of garlic to reduce blood pressure as well as to effect dilation of the blood vessels and detoxification of the entire organism. Patients also report themselves freed from apprehensions and neuroses they previously felt. Garlic, the evidence shows, is definitely a blood pressure regulator. It also favorably influences nervous cardiac manifestations and good results have been obtained in the female menopause, especially in those cases with accentuated pulse, hot flashes, irritability and insomnia.
