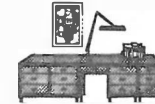

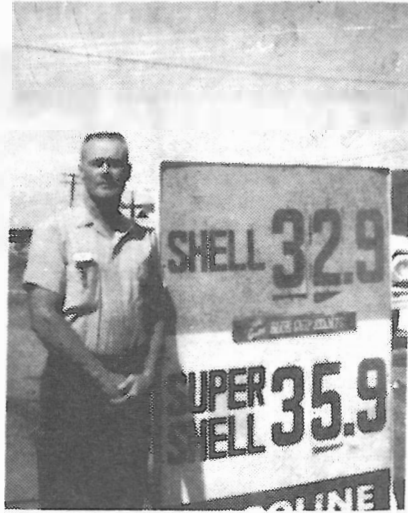

Anna Rhinehart sent us a nice letter from Echo, Oregon saying she was taking a rest and then would go back to working with horses.

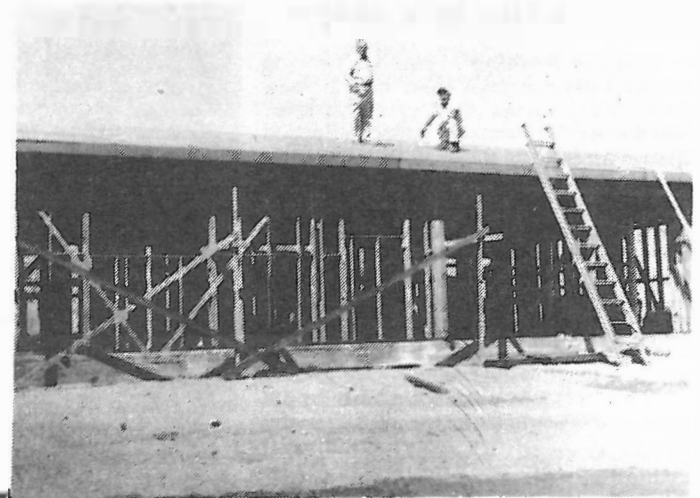
Eileen Dun's sister Peggy Moran brought over a thoroughbred broodmare for her sister June to ride.

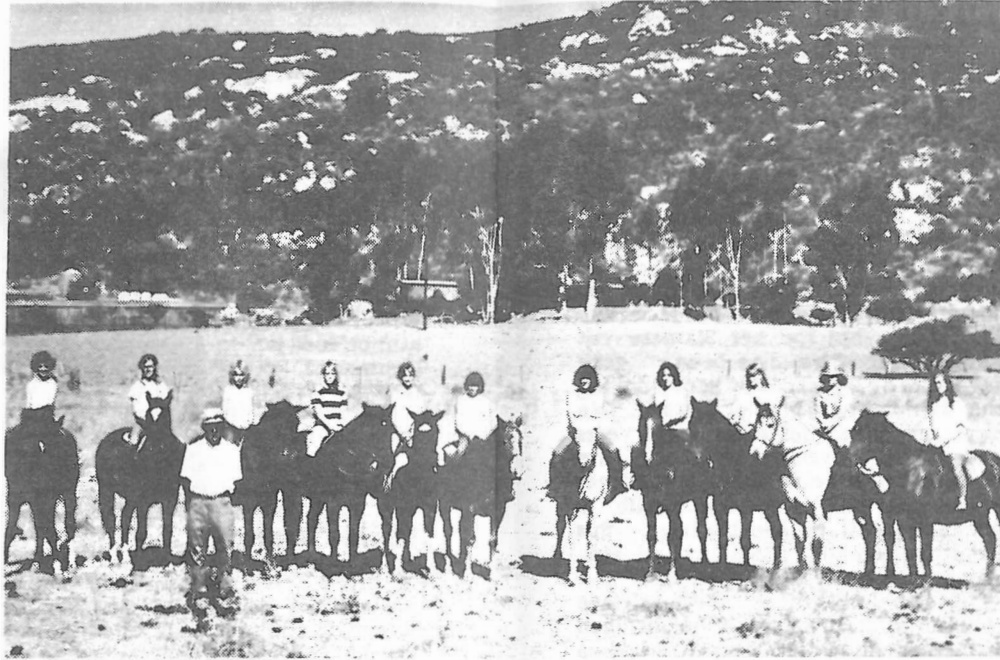

## BEWARE OF THOSE GLASS DOORS

The SD Health office advises folks who live in houses with sliding doors of glass to be extra careful as many have been so injured.

Children and adults often walk right into them, sometimes being badly cut if the glass breaks. Here is their advice on how to help prevent such mishaps: put decals or pressure tape on the door at a adult and child's eye level. Put safety bars at door handle level to prevent someone from hitting the glass. Place furniture or a planter in front of any fixed glass panel so that it is not mistaken for a door. Train children not to play near doors. Never assume a door is open. Someone may have closed the door you just opened.

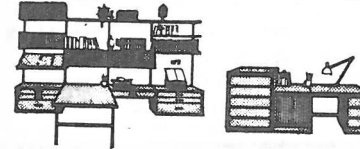
