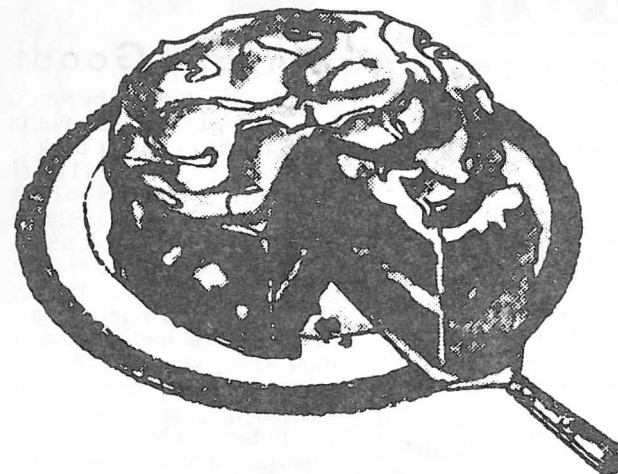

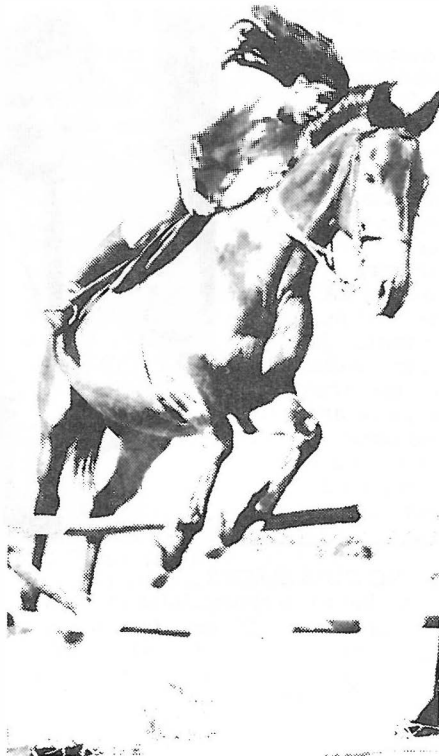
HORSE TALK

ren. She had been in ill health for some time. Dr. Roger Larson officiated, with Paris Mortuary handling arrangements. Burial was in Alpine Cemetery.

She was an Alpine resident since 1932, was the widow of Henry David Sturdivant, retired hotel man of Arkansas, who was the first president of the Alpine Chamber of Commerce. He was mayor of Gurdon, Ark., in 1905, died here April 10, 1961, age 92.

She was born in Antoine, Ark., on Feb. 27, 1897. The couple enjoyed their 50th wedding anniversary here on Sept. 19, 1947. Both were always active in civic affairs and helped organize and build Community Church.

CARE OF THE BODY

By Frances McTaggart

During the holidays most of us seem to get more than our share of sweets. One way to cut down on the consumption of commercial sugar is to substitute dried fruits. Here we offer a suggestion in the form of fruit balls made exclusively from natural foods.

We use unsulphured prunes, raisins, figs, (optional) apricots and dates (about 1½ lbs. after seeds & stems have been removed.) Put into food grinder along with one cup of shelled walnuts. Add 4 tbs. orange juice, mix & let stand in refrigerator several hours for easier handling. Then shape into balls the size of a large filbert & roll in ground coconut. Store in cans—these fruit gems get more mellow with age—if you can keep them around that long.
