Besides aspirin, kids will drink furniture polish, eat floor wax, sip insecticides and other such chemicals, if they find them around. Should a child get anything of this nature, call your doctor at once. It is well to read labels and know what is to be done in case anyone swallows some.

I remember a little boy of about 6 whose father tossed an "empty" carbolic acid bottle out behind the fence at their suburban home many years ago. He retrieved it, put it to his lips, but fortunately only a few drops painfully burned him. That inquisitive youngster was yours truly! -CI

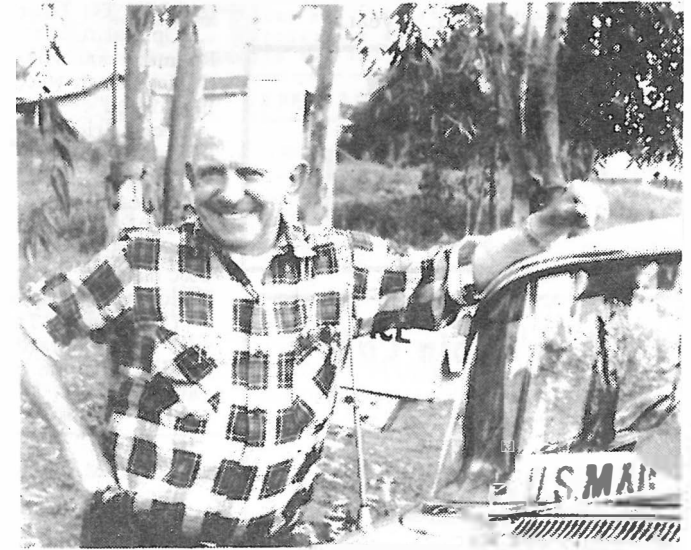

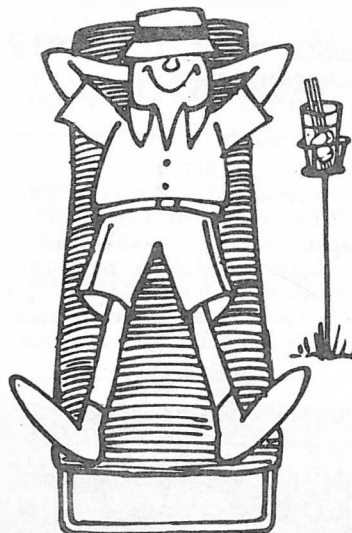
