#### SCIENCE PROGRESS OFFERS MUCH FOR PEACE.

While the world is tottering on the verge of a big war, and many nations, including the U.S., are having troubles, men of science are working on all manner of developments that will give mankind a better, easier and happier life-when final peace comes.

This is graphically seen in one little project of science, the tiny transistor, for example, whose age started just 20 years ago when it was born in the Bell Telephone Laborarories. It was hailed by scientists as one of the greatest inventions of the 20th Century.

Its discovery inaugurated a multibillion dollar industry and brought its three discoverers the Nobel Prize in Physics. They were Drs. John Bardeen, Wm. Schockley and Walter Brattain. They discovered that a minute piece of the element germanium could be made to amplify a speech signal about 40 times.





Many do not know that 5000 die yearly due to skin cancer! Yet it is mostly preventable, says the American Cancer Society. Over exposure to the hot sun



causes most cases. If more knew this, probably fewer would die. This is the most common form of cancer in the U. S. Doctors say that you should tan slowly, especially if your skin is fair. Dallas has 111 cases per 100,000 a year while Chicago, with less sunlight, has but 22. If you burn, and have blemishes for 2 weeks or longer, see your doctor. you may be in for trouble.

If you want a tan, go slowly, use oils or lotions, and if you work outdoors, get that tan slowly, and never let your skin burn, for the irritation may start cancer. Prevention is a lot better than having to cure that or any other ailment.

Remember, if you have a fair skin. that is with little pigmentation (brown) be extra careful of your sunbathing, and do not take a chance on ruining your health, perhaps jeopardizing your life. Keep out of that 5000 death list from skin cancer. Happy sunbathing, -slowly!
