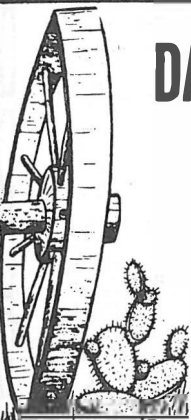

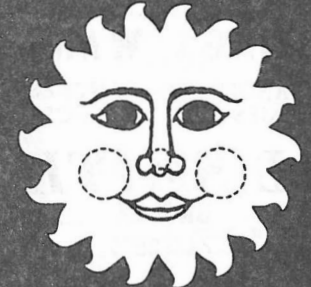

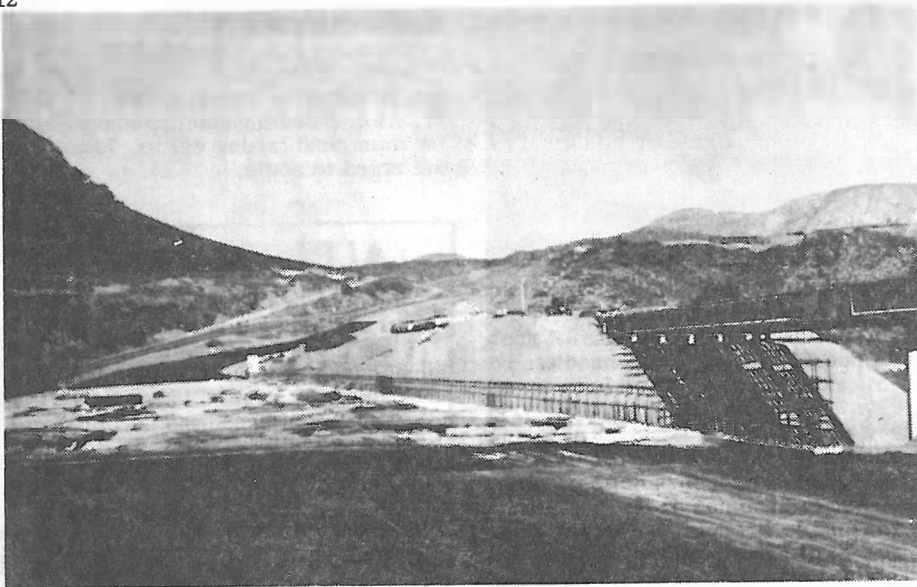

This week found the new US8 freeway almost completely paved, as shown above, looking west at the Peutz Valley overhead bridges. Note black-top at left on eastbound lane, now com-

plete from below W. Victoria Dr., to the present end of the freeway. This deck is ready for hotmix, while bridge on eastbound lanes at right is soon to be surfaced by Daley contractors, reports Jerry Smith, resident highway engineer.

Photo at right shows top end of 2nd Alpine section as it joins Deadman's Curve. Sun car in center is on new lanes, which is a high fill of canyon, made, watered and tamped from earth and rocks taken from small mountain at left of photo.

This new section should be open by Christmas, says Roger Kocher, resident highway engineer, and the Vinnell Corp. is right on schedule according to Pat Costanzo.

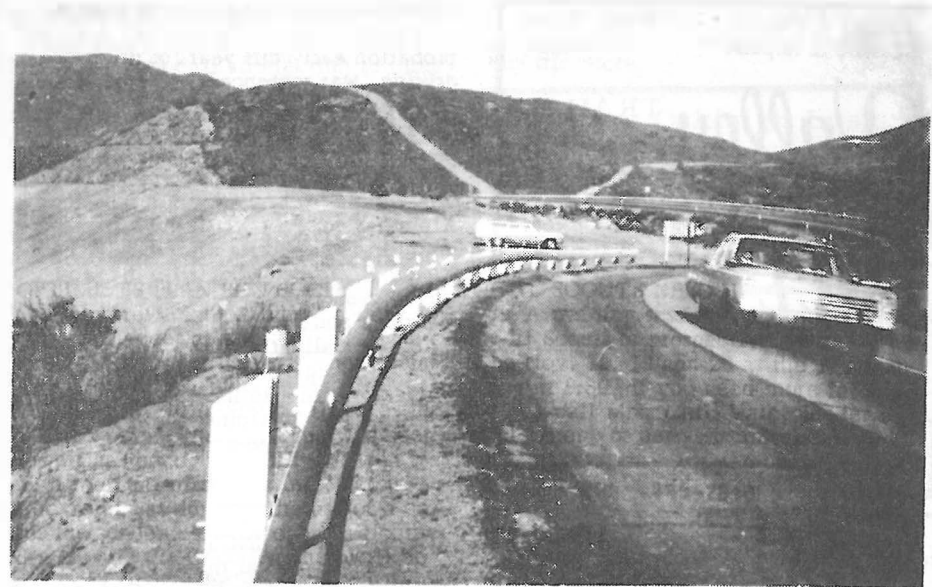

Tomorrow night Alpine Optimist Club will meet at the home of Al and Reenie Adams for their first box social, details from 445-2758.

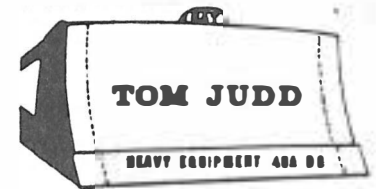

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of Rio San Diego Municipal Water District deems it necessary for the District to incur a bonded indebtedness to be payable from taxes levied upon less than all of the District; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Directors may form an improvement district within said District pursuant to Article 1, Chapter 3, Part 7, Division 20 (commencing with Section 71870) of the Water Code of the State of California);

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of Rio San Diego Municipal Water District DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER as follows:

Section 1: That it is deemed necessary for said District to incur a bonded indebtedness, to be payable from taxes levied upon less than all of the District (said area to be known as Improvement District No. 2) for the purpose of the acquisition, construction, completion and repair of a waterworks system, including reservoirs, pumping stations, transmission and distribution lines, conduits, pipelines, works, valves, meters, fittings, machinery and other property (including lands, easements, rights and privileges), and including water rights and existing waterworks systems, useful or necessary to store, convey, supply or otherwise make use of water for the lands and inhabitants within the exterior boundaries of said proposed improvement district, and all other property and expenses necessary for any of the foregoing, including engineering, inspection, legal, and financial consultant fees, costs of formation of said improvement district,

of the bond election and of the issuance of bonds, and all other costs and expenses incidental to or connected with the accomplishment of said purpose. 19

Section 2: That the amount of the proposed debt to be incurred for which bonds are to be issued therefor is the sum of \$200,000.

Section 3: That this Board intends to form an improvement district (to be known as Improvement District No. 2) pursuant to Article 1, Chapter 3, Part 7, Division 20 (commencing with Section 71870) of the Water Code of the State of California of a portion of the District which in the opinion of the Board will be benefited, the exterior boundaries of which portion are set forth in a map on file with the Secretary of the District, which map shall govern for all details as to the extent of the proposed improvement district, and to call an election in such proposed improvement district on a date to be fixed, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters thereof the proposition of incurring indebtedness by the issuance of bonds of the District for said improvement district.

Section 4: That taxes for the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon shall be levied exclusively upon the taxable property in the improvement district.

Section 5: That a general description of the proposed improvement, together with a map showing the exterior boundaries of said proposed improvement district with relation to the territory immediately contiguous thereto and to the proposed improvement; is on file with the Secretary of the District and is available for inspection by any person or persons interested.

Section 6: That Tuesday, the 12th day of November, 1968 at the hour of 7:30 o'clock, p.m., on said day, is hereby fixed as the time of the meeting of the Board of Directors of Rio San Diego Municipal Water District and the District's offices,
