Bootstrap's efforts, it points out "include teaching skills in key punching, computer programming, electronic assembly, power sewing, service station management, auto body and fender repair, typing and modeling.

Bootstrap subsists entirely on private financing and volunteer service, making use of equipment and instructors provided by private enterprise. Pacific Telephone has loaned equipment and instructors and placed people in telephone jobs.

Other parts of the program have motivation training, with classes in Black history and culture and other topics. It runs dress shops in the LA area which design, model and sell African styles, also a village restaurant with authentic foods and tradition, teaches cafe management.

Co-founder Robert Hall says it is "striving to change ghetto hopelessness into creativity. We're pursuing our dream-- to bring people together so they can grow. It's idealistic, but it works."

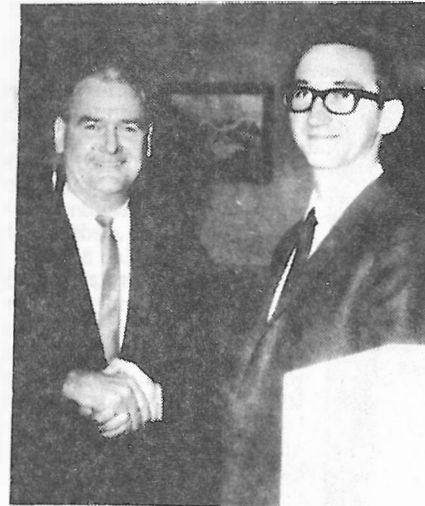

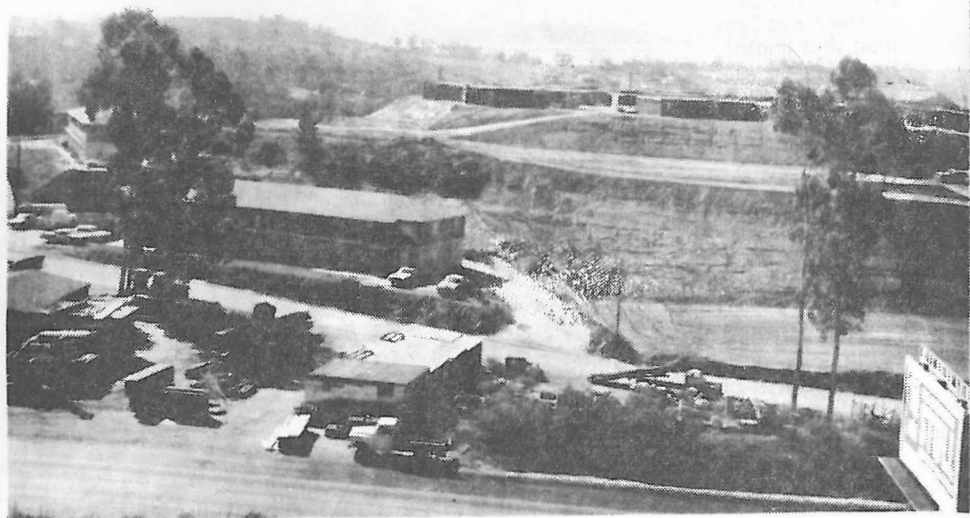

LIBRARY CIRCULATION OVER 10,000

The report of Arthur B. Murray, librarian in charge of the extensive county system, in his report just received, shows that they have 410,282 tomes with a circulation of 1,827,692 for the fiscal year, by the 138,150 borrowers in the 3,997 square mile area served.

Alpine's circulation is now 10,000. The county library was started on April 5, 1912. The state maintains 52 county libraries, all under the California County Free Library Act. It has been a model for many states, even foreign lands.

"If a book is not in our library", declares Elizabeth West, librarian here, "we can order it for you on blanks provided and if in, the book will be sent out at an early date".

PARCEL POST JOINS RISING COSTS

Postmaster H. T. Magnussen reminds patrons that catalog and parcel rates are now on the new higher level, an increase of an average 10%. This means around 10¢ a parcel over the old rate: local parcels that were 40¢ are now 50¢ and outside ones that went for 50¢ are now 60¢ minimums.



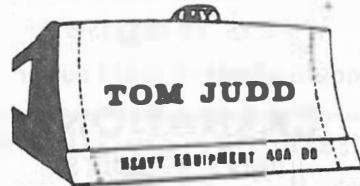
