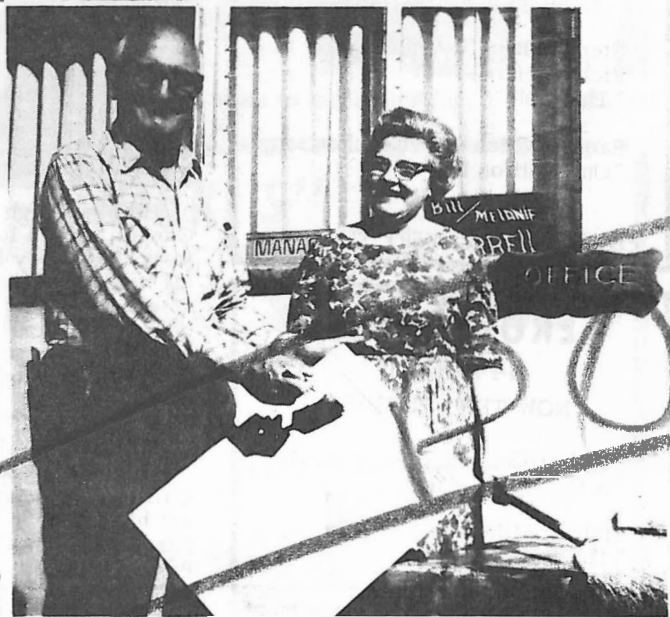
## FILL DITCHES IN NEW PARK

Things are looking up as earth goes down in the utility trenches at Alpine Vista Mobilhome Trailer Estates, 2400 Hwy 80, reports Mgr. Wm. Murrell, in photo with his charming wife Melanie, in front of their office-residence on the spot.

"The phone people are finishing their installations and with the water, sewer, power lines all in, and the gas line to be placed last", says Murrell, "we are beginning to feel better, for reservations are come in right along."

Pacific Telephone workers are lowering their cables into ditches to the two sections of the park. Over 40 have been paid in on reservations for this fine new facility.

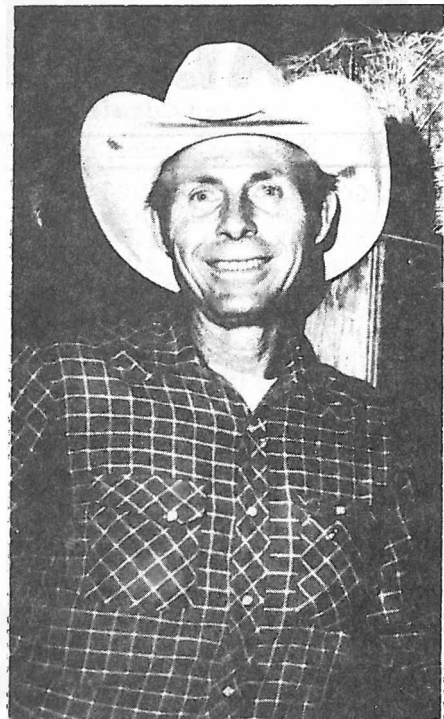

### 2 NEW FREEWAY LANES IN USE

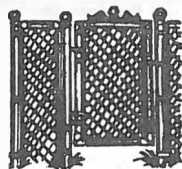
Yesterday traffic on Hwy 80 was slated to be shifted north to the newly paved westbound 2-lane half of new UW 8, reports Roger Kocher, resident highway engineer.

Above photo shows where traffic will be connected to Hwy 80 just below Deadman's Curve, the end of construction job of the Vinnell Corp. Thus traffic will be off the old route so it may be paved, then entire freeway will be opened about Feb. 1, with the 2-lanes each way from the old hazardous curve down to Willows Interchange.

Photo at right is an air shot made by Editor Irvine a week ago which shows the new lane on high earth fill, and the old one closer to the hillside.

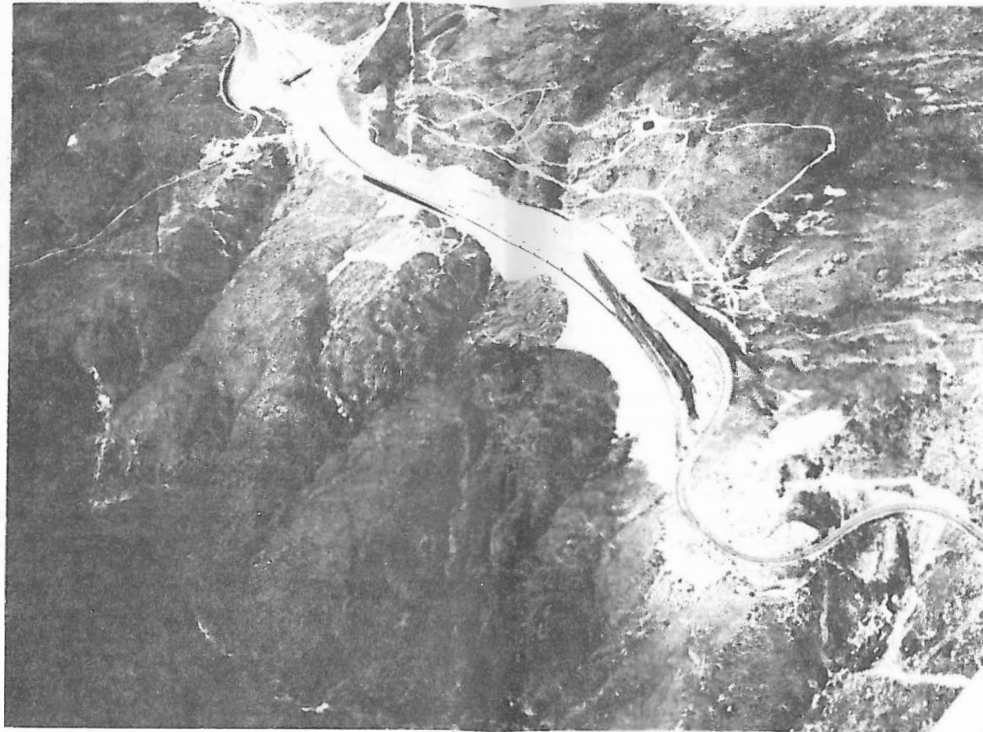
## ART MART HUGE SUCCESS

## TAKE YEAR TO MOVE MOUNTAIN

This revealing air shot by Editor Irvine looking northwest, graphically shows how freeway is progressing at Deadman's Curve.

Most of the mountain around which the hazardous curve winds at right is being "belted" across Hwy 80, to fill ravine at extreme right. New 4-lane highway will then pass over new fill, one of tallest in state.

Belt, 6' wide, 100' long, is motor operated '8' over highway. It carries rock and earth across road, drops it 75' into ravine where trucks move it to fill, explains Robt. Winterbourne, resident highway engineer.

Eastbound lane at left is now being used while right, or westbound route is being aligned and paved. Eventually

both will pass across base of excavated hill, go on east in easy curve to right close to Viejas Honor Camp.

Japatul Junction, Descanso and Pine Valley will be by-passed by new route which will join Hwy 80 rather up, then connect with newly opened eastern section of US 8.

Morrison-Knudsen firm's chief Turley says it will take year to move the mountain, a herculean task, but it will kill Deadman's Curve forever, to make way for fine new 4-lane freeway. To speed work they are putting on a night shift.


Steve and Colleen Jordan went to Thailand for a year. He is in the USAF, was transferred there from Mt. Laguna so his wife went with him.

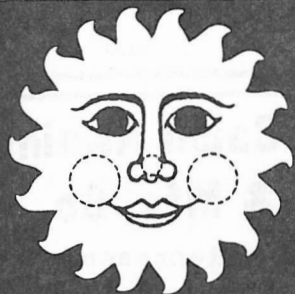

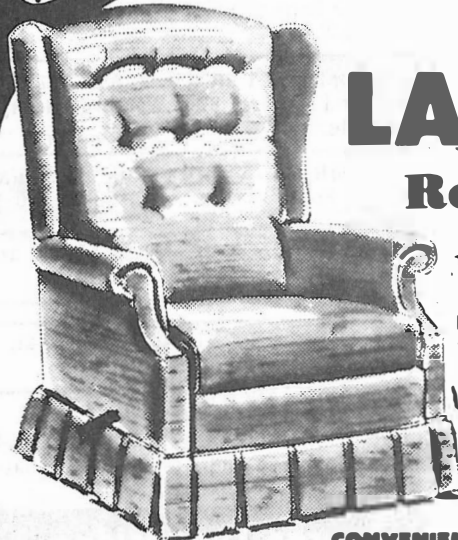
