"There is absolutely no excuse for the inordinately high traffic toll during the holiday just ended", he declares. "Christmas, and New Year's are meant to be joyous occasions, to be spent in happiness, yet 25 California families will remember this Christmas-- not with joy, but with sadness at the loss of a loved one".

While officials do not yet know how much alcohol was involved in the 25 fatals, they have worked hard to eliminate the drinking driver from roads and streets not only during the yule season, but on weekends, and daily as well.

Traffic statistics nationally show that liquor is involved in over 50% of auto deaths, and it is believed it could go higher if all accidents were to be investigated.

Records of the CHP and the Division of Highways usually predict about 12 or 13 deaths on a normal weekday with 16 or 17 on Saturday or Sunday. With that as a rule, Berke points out that there shouldn't have been more than 19 or 20 during the Christmas period. By comparison, he avers, last year's 4-day Christmas holiday brought 89 traffic deaths, an average of 22 a day, "and this was over a weekend which ordinarily is high anyway".

So now that 1969 is here, let us all endeavor to enjoy life and the pursuit of happiness, not with speed, but with caution.




