While looking that over-- with no little pride-- we read a splendid editorial by Matt Heslin, a G reporter. We felt it worth passing on. So here it is, headed "Lunatic Left' Slap on bee-hind the answer:

I wonder how many of the college and university students realize what a fabulous gift they have in being able to attend school and to sit down and choose a course of study that will someday possibly lead to a profession and future security. Not many, I'm afraid, as evidenced by the rioting and turmoil on our nation's campuses. There are some students who are

serious about learning, and it is a shame that their wonderful opportunity is being marred by a few radicals.



They took two siamese cats, said "they were the best travelers we have ever had and they seemed to enjoy themselves immensely."



Here is air shot by Editor Irvine made recently while flying over entire freeway project. This is the upper Willows Interchange, looking north onto Viejas Reservation.


Bridges are for access roads this side of new route, also on and off ramps. Note Willows Road turn to left, middle of picture.

What these militant groups are doing is not dissent and certainly not education - rather it is a direct threat to the very idea of our universities. I don't feel the fault lies completely with the students, however, I believe it is a leadership problem. One minute the college administrators are siding with these student groups, and the next minute they are taking a hard stand of authority. This inconsistency is a sign of weakness in the "administrative wall" - a weakness that has been noted by the militants.

Perhaps now is the time to reinforce that wall with bayonets. When children misbehave because of lack of recognition, sometimes a spanking is in order.
