EDITORIAL

URGE LIFTING BAN ON CERTIFIED RAW MILK.

The March Santa Monica Organic Garden & Nutrition Club Bulletin advises members and their friends to send letters or telegrams to state officials to rescind the ban on raw, certified milk.

They suggest in writing to senators and assemblymen that since the banning of raw milk does not protect non raw milk drinkers against contracting Q fever through airborne sources, and since it is only those who use it whom the authorities wish to protect, and since no raw milk user has ever contracted Q fever, nor has any fear of getting it, and "since we feel that raw milk is absolutely necessary for our continuing

good health, it is obvious that banning it is contrary to the interests and desires of those whom the authorities say they wish to protect, we ask you to please annul this ban and show all concerted that a mistake has been made in initiating the action".

The right to choose, is one angle of the argument, just the same as in the case of fluoridating all city water. It has been well established that heating foods, including pasteurization of milk, devitalizes it, robs it of important elements the body needs for perfect health. Since testing began in 1946, no case of Q fever has been traced to milk.

ACR 45 was introduced in the legislature to have the ban rescinded. Everyone interested in freedom, and health, and the right to choose, is urged to write legislators to vote for ACR 45. Certified raw milk must come from clean, healthy cows in an inspected dairy, and has been used for many years by those who recognize the perfect food values of raw foods.

Certified milk is rich in nature-pure protein, vitamin, mineral and enzyme content. It has none of the dead bacteria of pasteurized milk, for heat kills all - the good and the bad germs. -- besides the American public dislikes the bureaucratic action that puts a ban on good, pure food. -CI

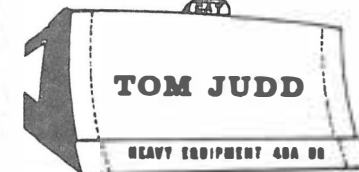

GIVE ADDRESS CHANGE EARLY

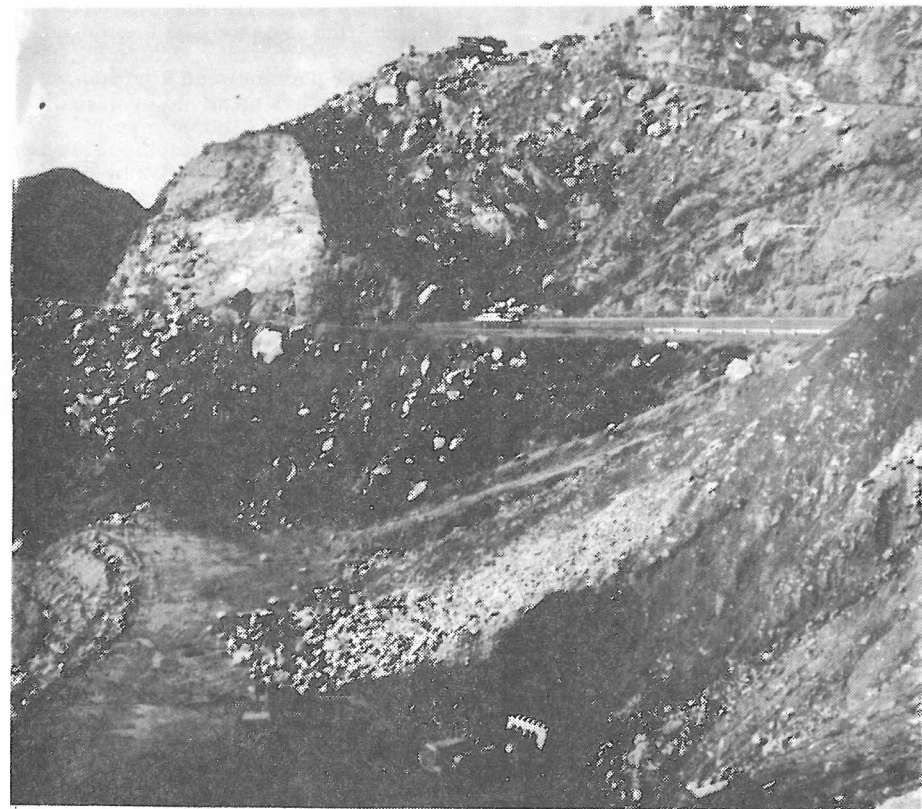
Postmaster H. T. Magnussen advises people planning on a move to send in change-of-address as early as possible, even 4 weeks ahead.

This bad spot on Hwy 80, Deadman's Curve, will be no more in another year when the mountain is moved into the intervening canyon where trucks are taking it to the east end. This looks west. At right is huge pile of earth and granite that is being belted over highway, as shown in photo on next page.

Like the rest of the three freeway jobs, this one suffered over a month's delay due to rains, but is now going apace.

Note big truck at top center coming

down to dump into hopper that feeds motor driven belt where two men inspect it. Note big rocks on belt.

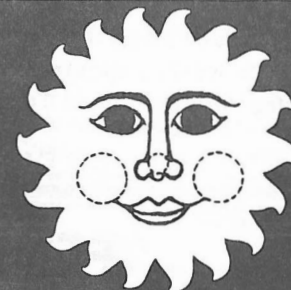

SUN GOES TO TOP OF MOUNTAIN!

Here is what none ever sees, unless he be a hardy climber, for the editor hiked to the top of the small mountain they are removing at Deadman's Curve. Little do motorists realize when they pass under the belt just what is going on at the summit.

Photo looks northeast as shovels, loaders, dozers and huge trucks eat away the solid rock hilltop. At right is the powder crew drilling and filling 40' holes for the blast.

Fortunately Robt. Winterbourne, resident highway engineer on this huge job being done by Morrison-Knudsen Co. of Phoenix, happened to be there, so explained it all.

"In order not to have falling rock on the highway, we use a slightly delayed double blast which opens the rock, then makes it fall this way, instead of an

ordinary blast that pushes it in all directions. Thus we control the fall".

He said 1½ million yards of earth and rock will be taken from here to make the deep fill, straightening out the new freeway lanes. A like amount will come from the top of a hill near the honor camp to complete the mammoth fill. See photos elsewhere.

Aboard the USS Eldorado, back from 8 months in the Western Pacific, are FTC/3 Richard T. Wangler, and his brother EM/3, Francis A. Wangler, sons of the Robert E. Wanglers of Alpine. Eldorado is flagship of the amphibious force, based at SD. She spent some time in the Philippines.

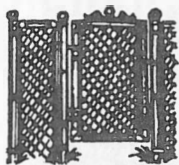

LIVELY OAKS DOINGS

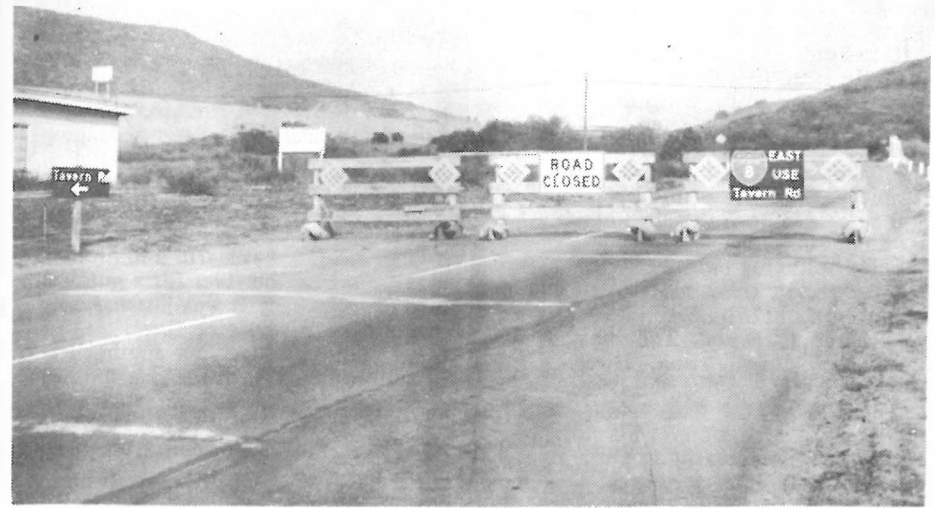

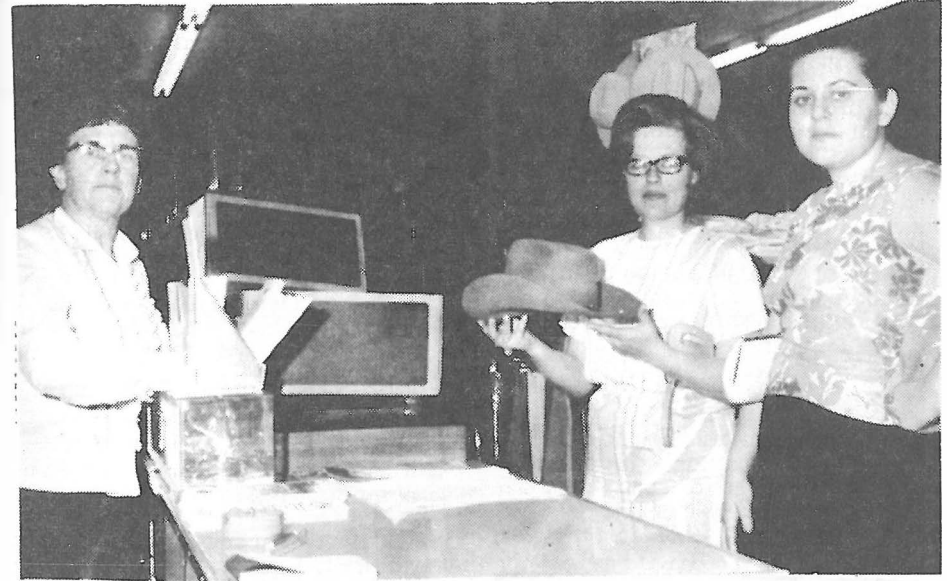

This followed a special meeting Monday at the home of Clayborne LaForce, chairman of the chamber's planning committee.

The chamber had voted \$200 for a study of the plan offered by the county to join Lakeside if a \$580,000 bond vote could be put over. They came up with the idea of going into Dehesa Valley, combining with Otay to process, then sell the water.

While it would cost more, it could save a lot in the long run. The change is necessitated by the growth of Alpine, and its effluent from the present system polluting water running into El Capitan Reservoir.

At Monday's session here, Supervisor Chairman Henry Boney was present with his administrative assistant, Ron Fuller, H. T. Magnusson, president of the local C of C, Houser, and engineers from the Otay district.

In a letter to water customers here, Houser stated: "By working jointly with Otay MWD, it will be possible to deliver waste water to the Sweetwater River Basin below Dehesa for treatment. This plan would provide for re-use of the treated water for limited purposes such as development of green belts, parks and recreation".

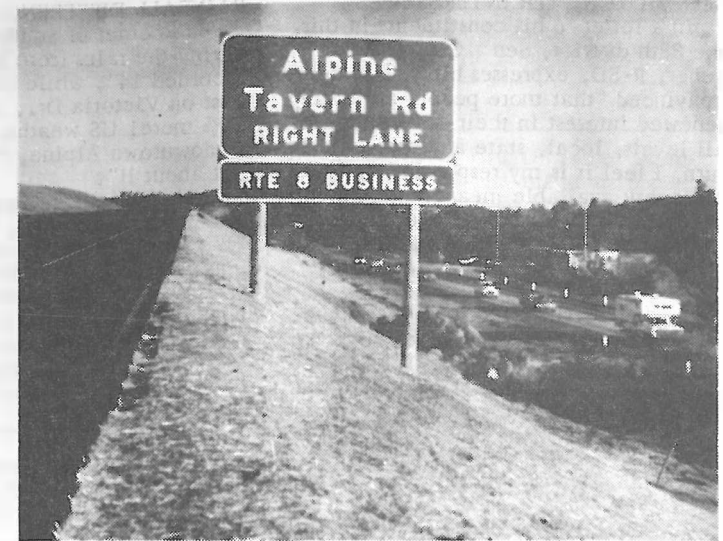
