Editor's Note: The other day while browsing through he Sun file we saw an editorial from Nov. 1962, which I think applies more than ever to today's frightening situation:

If the present increase of spending at all levels of government is not slow-ed, soon we will be entire-ly free of paying taxes! Quite simple! Today millions are employed working for governments. The more we spend, the more workers it takes to process' everything. This year Uncle Sam blew the largest amount in his life, \$115 billion, during peacetime year. Our public debt is \$302 billion, well past the absolute red danger point. It is the largest in
