



WOMAN'S CLUB ELECTS ADAMS



Lucas is a senior scientist in electronics with Lockheed Oceanography.

Sunday and Monday he and Wm, Bridge, executive director of the SD Hall of science where they are building the new planetarium, came up out of foggy SD to track Apollo 10 in Alpine's clear atmosphere. After careful study of charts and schedules the two scientists spotted the tiny spacecraft near Castor & Pollux above the young moon, and your editor had the thrill of looking at it.

The small flying object with its 3 brave astronauts spun slowly over half-way to the moon, reflecting sunlight from its windows and body, growing and diminishing in magnitude as it

sped moonward.

Wayne Johnson, secretary of the Jaycee's big East County Fair at Gillespie Field, May 28-June 1, says Carol, Marsha, Humbug and Yoko will make their first appearance at the big show.

WORK ON SECOND MAIL ROUTE

Burgeoning Alpine and the opening of I-8 through the area have necessitated the splitting of Route 1 here into two in order to facilitate handling and cutting down on mileage, reports Postmaster H. T. Magnussen. He has been measuring and timing the overpasses and bridges so as to make the two routes most efficient and speedy.

"We expect to finish the survey shortly, then submit the plan which could be approved soon and the switch made", he says.

one, which was prepared by the county Dept. of Special Services last year. It calls for abandoning the local system which cost \$120,000, and will be reaching capacity when Alpine Village and Vista Alpine Mobile Home Estates are occupied by 443 families, plus the fast growth of the community.

Supervisor Harry Scheidle told how time is running out and the county plan should be approved. He did not oppose Otay, but it meant delays, and time is the essence now as the water control office says the Alpine menace of pollution to El Capitan Reservoir must be remedied by 1971.

The bond issue of \$580,000 would allow \$80,000 for buying into the Lakeside district, the issue going for lines from here to there. Application has been made for a federal grant which would return Alpine about 30% of the project's cost.

Warren Barney, special district's head, said the local plant is nearing capacity, 70,000 gallons daily, 36,000 being now the total which comes from 150 families. The water control office has said that 50,000 gallons is top capacity. Supervisors said an election will be set within three months.

PIERCE HEADS GH STUDY GROUP

With 2 bond issues defeated for added room at Grossmont Hospital, 156 beds, a citizens advisory committee of 15 has been named to study the problem, with Auren Pierce, Alpine realty developer as chairman.

They will work up a master plan, a timetable for expansion, financing, and winning public support for the community institution which serves the 730-sq. mile

district.




