to the awarding of this contract as being "beclouded" and the short-lived flash of sharp words the board exchanged with the representative of the Goodall Bus Line created an atmosphere that was less than routine.

Of the four companies who originally participated in the competition only Aztec and Patchetts resubmitted bids. Though Patchetts was not the lowest bidder the board felt that the nominal difference represented would not warrant a change in contractors in view of the satisfactory service that Patchetts has provided during the past five years. The vote was unanimous.

Note- It seems a farce that the board may legally refuse the low bid in favor of another firm which is what made this meeting rather hot. Why spend money to advertise and monkey with bids when the low bid is turned down?

Pat Doogan of Aztec was present, told the Sun "I was amazed by the award because the lowest bidder was eminently qualified to do the job". His firm, founded by an Alpiner, A.L. Willingham, was low bidder. Doogan has over 27 years experience, says most contracts are for one year, not five.

J. E. Ruane, of Goodall was present, but did not re-bid, endeavored to explain some points on the matter, but was ordered to sit down, being out of order. None was present to represent Patchetts, which is a firm in Newman, Calif.

Ruane told the Sun "As far as competitive bid procedures in this district go, they do not exist". His firm has been in business for 13 years. The matter leaves the taxpayers in a quandary. -- CI.

#### DIRKSEN'S DEATH SHOWS NATIONAL TRAVESTY.

When America's talented, astute and lovable old Sen. Everett McKinley Dirksen died Sunday, his demise proved how the US is living a cruel travesty of humaneness, honesty and wanton love of money

Day after day on radio and TV we hear those asinine, farcial commercials advertising cigarets. Then follows shortly a usually well done equal time ad against smoking.

Every time science comes up with new proof that cigaret smokers are more likely to get cancer of the smoke inhalation route, the tobacco barons who love money more than their fellow men, shout their heads off.

Dirksen paid the penalty for being a chain-smoker. First he had to have a lung removed with its cancer. Then he died. He did not have the resistance and pure blood to overcome the shock. Too bad.






