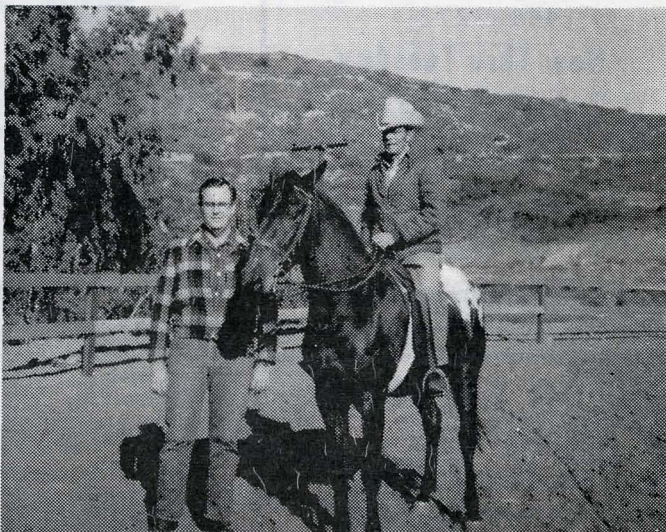
ALPINE HAS BASKETBALL STAR

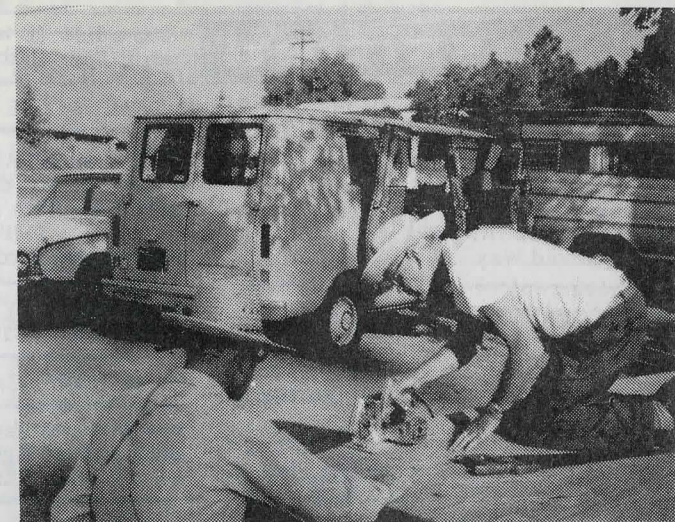
