

### **EDITORIAL**



#### GREATEST MENACE TO MAN IS POLLUTED AIR!

While America kills 1000 a week in traffic, hundreds die from the flu, heart attacks and other ailments including dreaded cancer, we seem to be going blithely along while the atmosphere gets dirtier and dirtier.

Only last month the director of public health, Dr. J. B. Askew ran a story in the bulletin from his office on how the public resents dirty air.

"Calls protesting air pollution have more than doubled since July. Smoke emissions have been reported from construction and other industrial sources ", he wrote.
