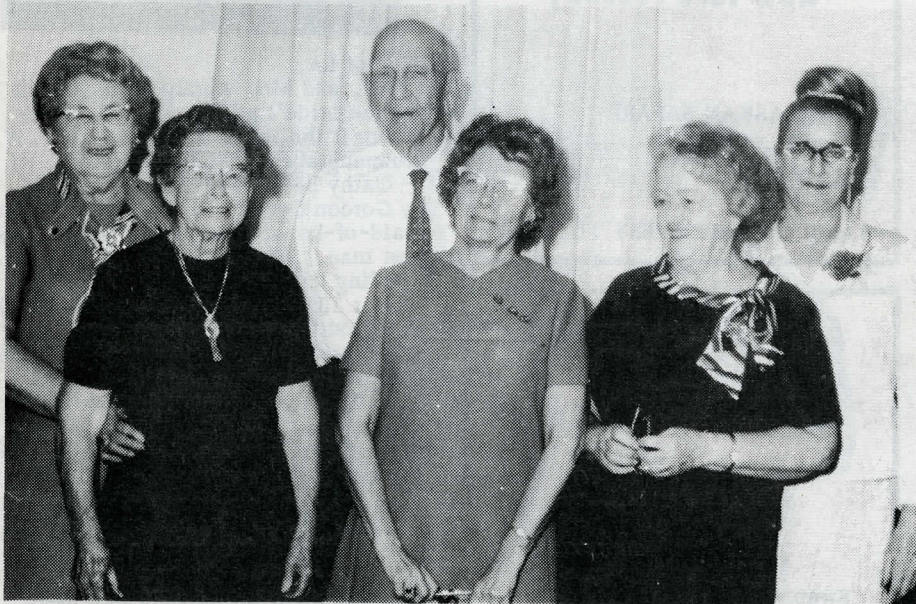



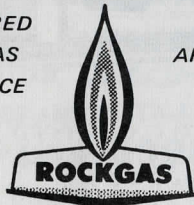

The chamber moved to support the County plan, ask for an early bond election, and condemn the efforts being made to dissolve the district. The directors hope that all members will now follow their lead and do whatever they can to resist the efforts to dissolve the district.

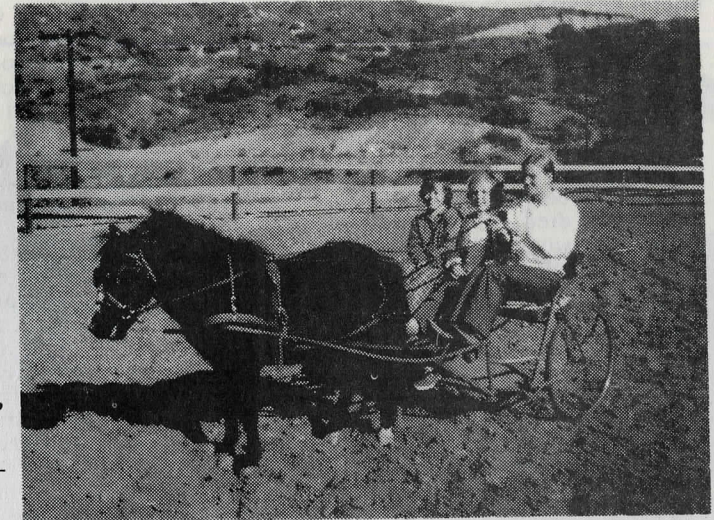

This one here is owned by Medical Growth Industries Real Estate Co., of which Christopher D. Sickles is president, who own Vista Alpine Mobile Home Estates and the two Alpine Convalescent Center buildings.
