Mrs. Borter was here at the time, having come out for her annual visit.

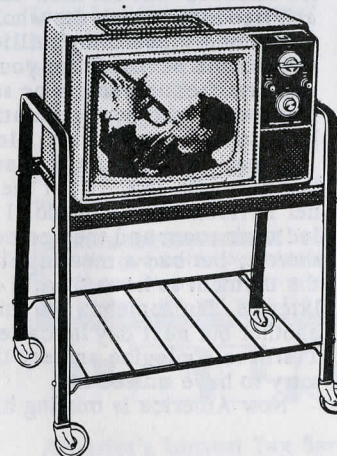
**GUSTAFSONS

EDITORIAL



NATION LOST FINE STATESMAN IN JAMES UTT

California and the whole country was shocked to learn that Cong. James B. Utt, R-Calif. of Tustin, died of a heart attack in Bethesda Naval Hospital, which had struck him while in church Sunday.

It was a deeper shock to us because we have known him, having met his family when he was a young man, 46 years ago when he was 24, being 70 when he died. We knew his parents, followed his career all those years. They operated the Utt Juice Co., which is still in existence there, becoming

famous for its pure juices "Queen Isabel-la" brand.

The congressman was a soft-spoken, kindly gentleman, but, like Teddy Roosevelt, he believed in being outspoken and carrying somewhat of a big stick. He was a conservative member of Congress from our 35th district. He had recently announced his candidacy for a 10th term.

He was opposed to big government and civil disobedience, which he thought lead to anarchy, which today no doubt are doing when we look at the troubles here and abroad. He had criticized President Nixon for not carrying out some of his campaign promises.

Utt served in the state assembly from 1932 to 1936, was inheritance tax appraiser for the state controller's office for 16 years. Born in Tustin, March 11, 1899, he was graduated from Orange County schools, USC law school, and received an honorary LLD at Bob Jones U in Greenville, S.C. In Santa Ana he practiced law, was a citrus rancher, in addition to being active in the juice business.

Like many good Americans, Utt was for his country first, last and always. He believed that our hard-earned liberty and freedom, which the whole world envies and which bring millions here to live, could be lost if the young generation lets them go and as he stated here last month "the next generation will have to buy them back in blood".

I shall never forget the last time I saw him with Mrs. Utt at the GOP dinner in Hotel del Coronado, I had called their room and they came down shortly, but had a meeting slated at the moment so he said we'll see you later on. But somehow we missed one another but next day he called from Tustin to apologize and say they were sorry to have missed me.

Now America is missing him! --CI

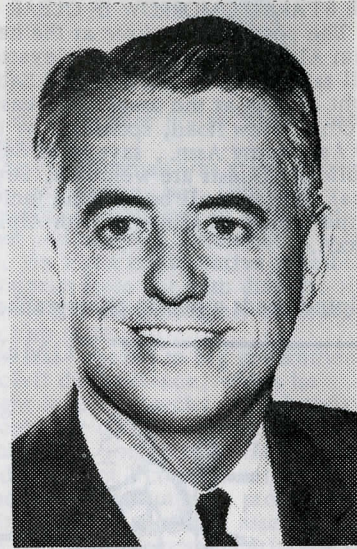

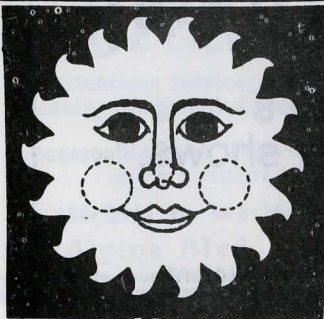

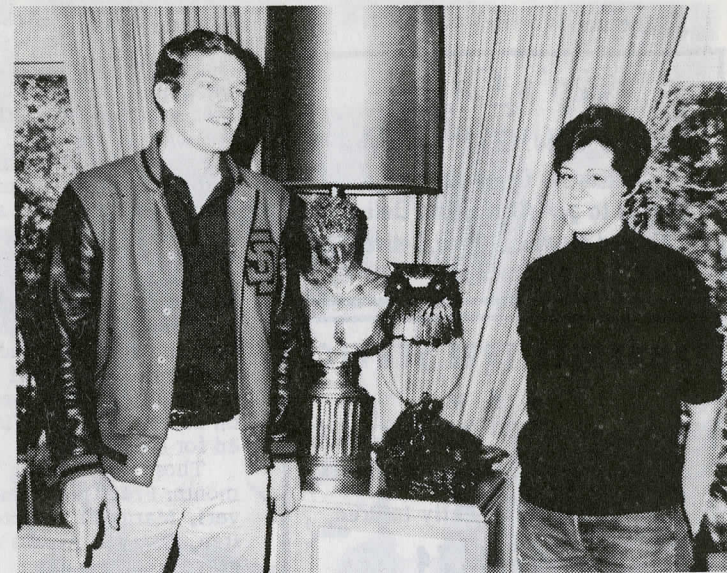

you can, say officers.

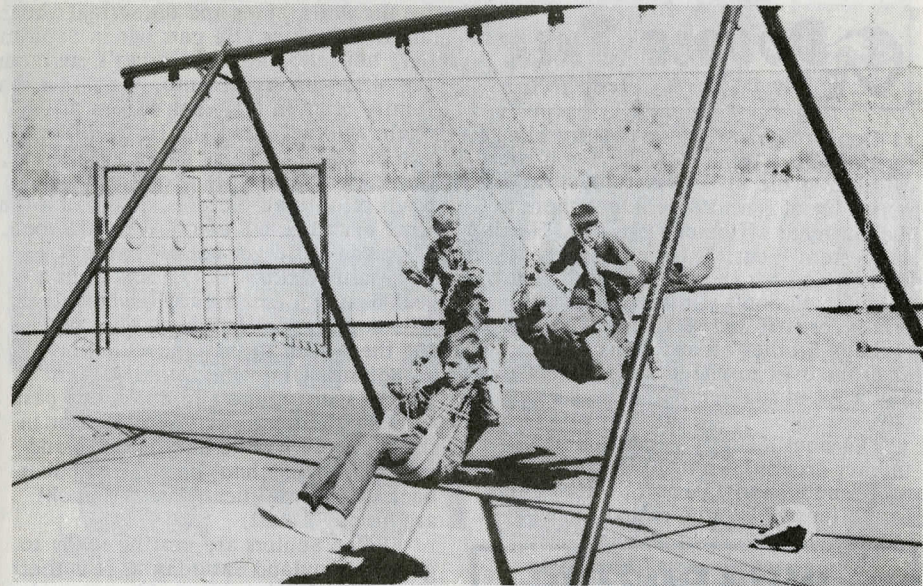
Also Pat Naud in charge of the H&R

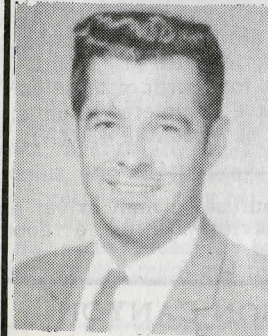

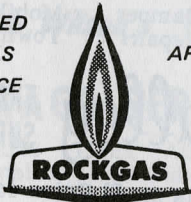

A county team, G. M. Bowman, senior civil engineer, and Paul Exley, from the engineer office, building inspection division, were here last week in a conference with Fire Chief Dale Bennett, Postmaster H. T. Magnussen, and Editor Irvine, to start a campaign to get all houses numbered and streets named to facilitate emergencies and building permits.

AN EARLIER NAME FOR ALPINE?

Elizabeth West, librarian here, showed the Sun 1967 bulletin on historic development of SD County, put out by the planning office.

For this community it says "Alpine was so named because of certain similarities to the Alpine area of Europe. In Spanish and Mexican times the area was known as 'Mesa de Rosas'".

Mrs. West noted that it was because El Cajon Mountain, northwest of here, turns pink for a few fleeting seconds just at sunrise. Likewise, at sunset, Viejas Mountain, northeast of town, turns to a bright magenta at sunset. Both colorings are believed to be due to the red of the sunrise or sunset combining on the green of the mountains to produce a rich color. Take note of these phenomena of color.

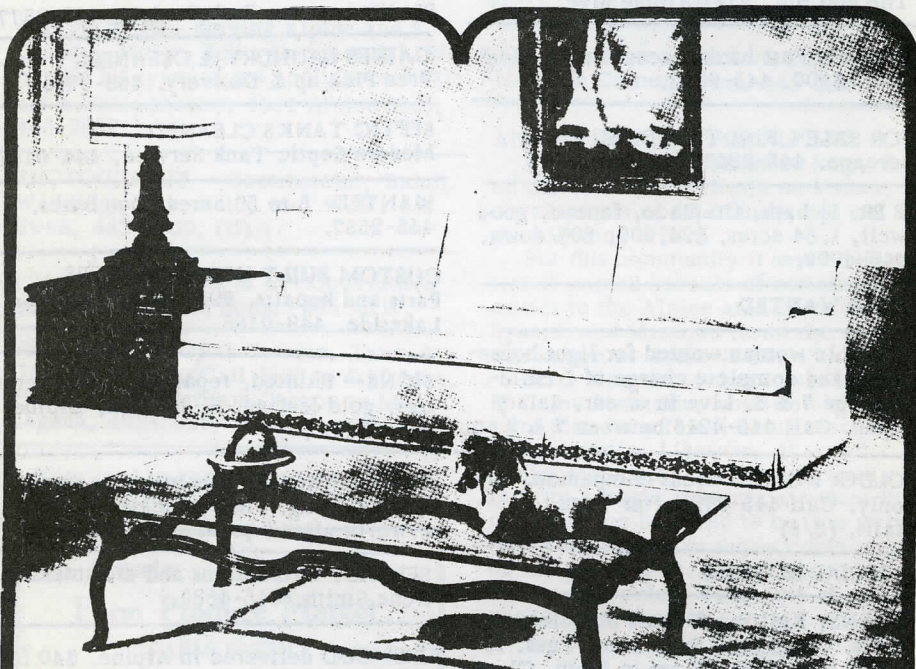
