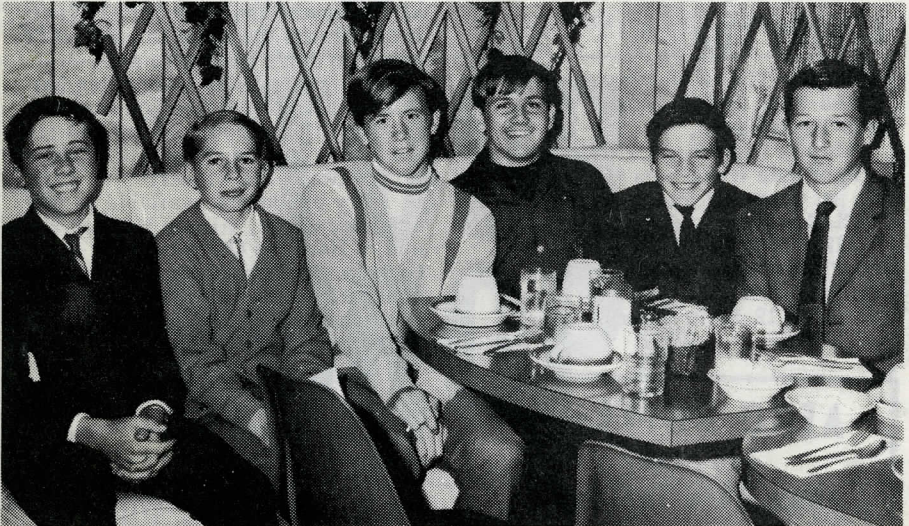
## FACTORY MANAGER BUYS HOME

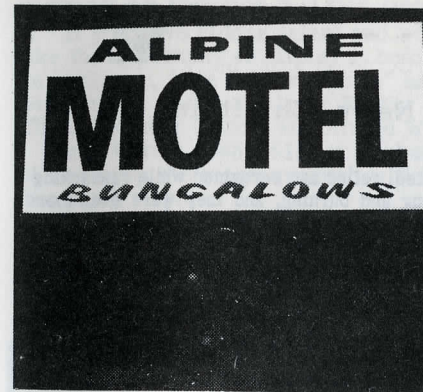
## CHAMBER OF COMMERCE COMMENTS

# EDITORIAL

## 'CITIZENS SHOULD ARISE'

IT is time to speak out!

I am constrained to write this column. Perhaps a local paper should stick to community news and happenings but I believe it is past time that good citizens should exercise their right to cry out in protest of the violence and ruthlessness of the protesters, no matter whether those protesters are young or old or whether they wear beards or are clean shaven, or whether their hair is long or short.

IF avowed and convicted rioters, seeking not only to disrupt the normalcy of a large community but to do so by extreme acts of violence, including destruction of property and lives, are not the type of individuals to be kept behind bars pending appeals, then God help the law-abiding citizen of this land, for he is not going to get any help from those jurists who are so willing to defend the rights of criminals while depriving you and me of our right of protection against this type of subversive revolutionary activity.

The action of the 7th District Court of Appeals in releasing the seven hoodlums in Chicago, who were duly convicted after an arduous, tumultuous and rebellious trial, is an unconscionable decision which makes a mockery of the decision of the court and of the efforts of the trial judge to maintain not only law and order during the trial but dignity and decorum, and respect for the American system of legal proceedings. In many countries the type of conduct exhibited by not only the defendants but their attorneys would have resulted in banishment from which they would never return. Their acts during the trial are strong testimonial to the type of conduct with which they were charged and convicted, and designed only to disrupt and hopefully to bring about mistrials.

THIS decision by the Appellate Court now permits them to continue mockery and attack on our system while enjoying all the legal benefits, and it will give them the further opportunity to stir up trouble across the land, as apparently has already resulted in Santa Barbara just from the mere appearance of counsel William Kunstler who, in addressing the students there said in a masterful bit of double talk, "Let your voices be heard loud and strong."

THERE is little doubt that the voices of the rioters were heard loud and strong as they



chanted, yelled and screamed while ransacking looting and burning, and they were even more vociferous in attacking the police as "Pigs" and "Facists."

FOR nearly thirty years my primary vocation has been concerned with "the law", particularly as it relates to criminal law. I am totally in accord with the American system of jurisprudence which requires the guilt of an accused to be established beyond a reasonable doubt. In those nearly thirty years I do not believe I have ever seen a case where an innocent man was wrongly convicted but I do know for a fact that many guilty men were set free because of the requirements of proof.

DURING this period I have seen the laws change drastically as far as protecting the rights of individuals accused of crime, with each change making it more difficult to apprehend and convict the criminal. I cannot totally disagree with all the changes for some are basic rights and I would want them for myself or someone near and dear to me.

HOWEVER, somewhere along the line it seems that those sitting at the Appellate level who are so eager to defend and protect the rights of the single individual, have lost sight of the fact that their rulings should also apply to the protection of millions of persons who choose to obey the law and live their lives as a part of a democratic majority as useful, law-abiding citizens, and that they too have absolute rights to be defended, especially against mobism, terrorism, tyranny; those who - take the law into their own hands and then appeal to the courts to protect them from the establishment.

I for one am sick and tired of lawlessness in our country which benefits from all the overzealous protection the courts and the Constitution affords, while the lawless are working in their brainless way to destroy it all at the same time.

I want my rights protected and I am sure you do. Something must be wrong with our requirements and methods for selecting individuals as jurists.

I think it is time for a change, a change that will restore sanity to the land and to our courts.

I think it is about time that the great "silent majority" start speaking out and taking action.

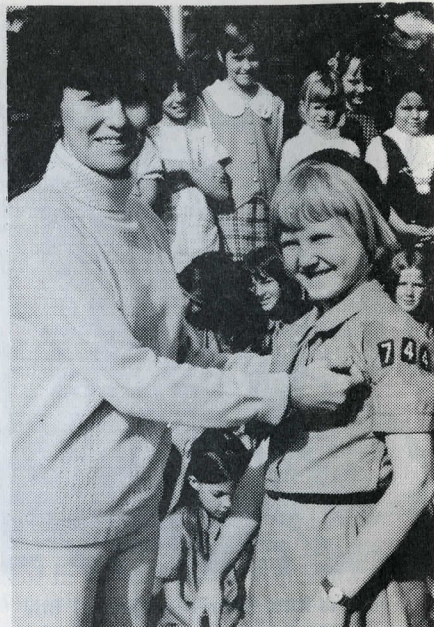

### SCHOOL SURVEY SHOWS MUCH

Dr. Jas. Thrasher reported to the school board Monday night on the citizens' committee probe into the situation here, that growth means more classrooms are urgently needed.

Largest growth is on Tavern and South Grade Roads which totals about 2/3rds of the present growth.

Enrollment today is 787 plus the 15 special (mentally retarded) students and that by making some changes it will get Alpine through to 1971.

By Sept. 1970, enrollment may reach 900. One way to solve this is to make three teaching stations on the auditorium floor with lights, floor covering, blackboards and portable partitions. The same could be done at the Canyon school. "This could get us through 1971", said Dr. Thrasher.

No new building can be expected for from 18 to 24 months. Hot lunches can be served from the present kitchen right into classrooms, instead of in the auditorium. It would be used for classrooms.

### START USING STREET NUMBERS

H. T. Magnussen, PM at Alpine, says they are starting to convert to house numbers instead of route box numbers in all deliveries of mail. Midway Drive is the first, covering 15 boxes, he says. Alpine volunteer firemen are to paint the boxes at a nominal cost.

### LENGBRIDGE 50 YEARS IN ELECTRONICS

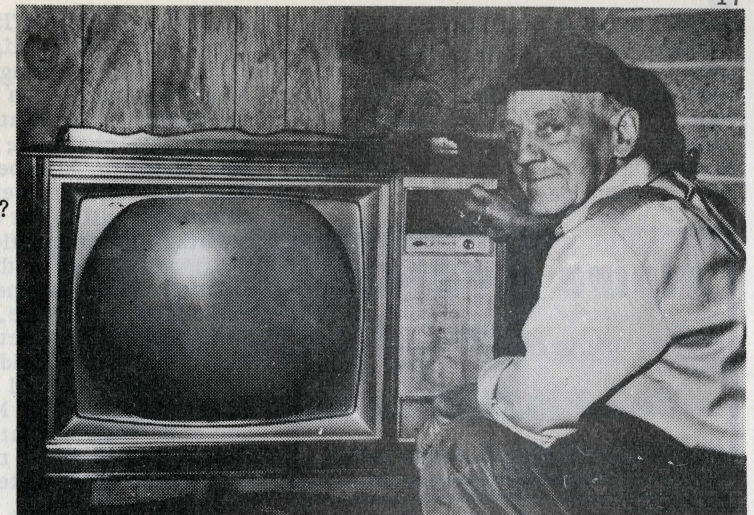
What keeps a man of 80 in fire spirits, good health and busy as a TV serviceman?

"What do you want them for" asked George, who was always mechanically minded. He even invented a machine to develop and dry the plates, "so I could take care of more customers in-



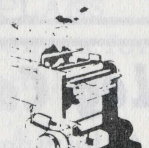
stead of being tied up in my darkroom". The machine was automatic, so all he did was place the exposed glass plates in, turn it on, and it stopped itself when finished.

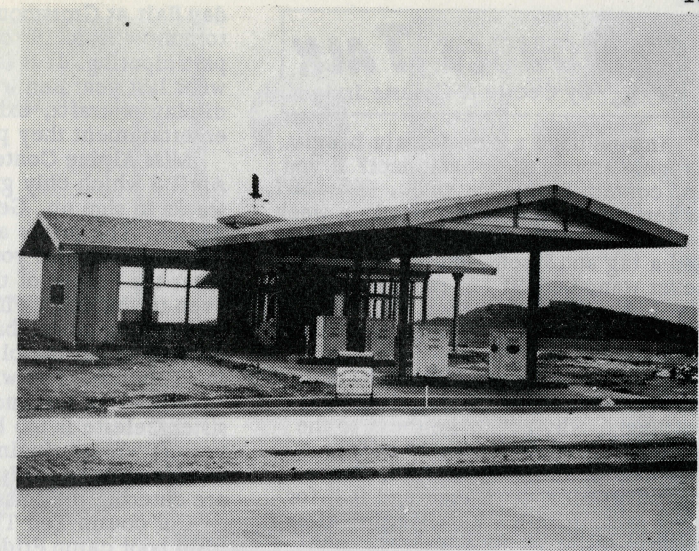

### MORE DELAY FOR RICHFIELD

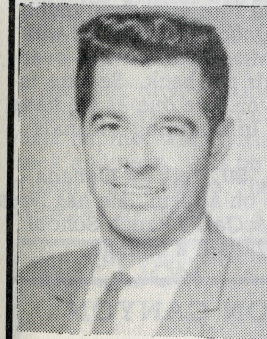

## HOSS SENSE

By Cynthia McTaggart

One of the most common mistakes you see around horses is that of improper bridling. There is a right way which is much easier and takes half the time. A beginner can take 20 minutes to put on the bridle that the experienced horseman gets on in 20 seconds.

There are several steps in bridling, the first is the approach. The horseman comes up to the head from behind or from the side and on the left. He carries the crown piece in his left hand, the ends of the reins in his right. Stand at the horses shoulder facing front. Never try to bridle a horse while standing in front, as this will cause him to back away from you.

Next slip the reins over his head, and rest them in back of the poll, close

to the ears. Transfer the bridle to the right hand and put in position on the head, the cheek pieces on either side of the jaws, the crown piece and brow-band resting on the forehead below the ears, the bit dangling against the teeth. This is the main cause of difficulties for novice horsemen because for many, the horse will refuse to open his mouth to receive the bit.

To overcome this, place the left thumb in the exact center and at the bottom of the bit (if using a snaffle, the point where the joint comes) the fingers of that hand reach under the chin and are inserted into the horse's mouth on the far side coming to rest against the bars. There is no danger of being bitten as there are no teeth at this point. As soon as he opens his mouth, pull up on the crown piece at the same time guiding the bit into the mouth. Slip the crown piece over the ears and finally be sure to buckle the throatlash. This will prevent the bridle from being rubbed or slipping off.

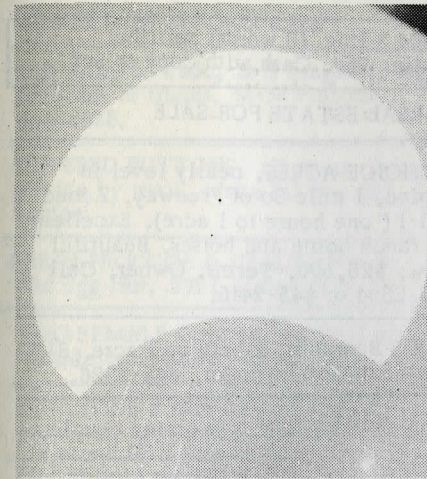

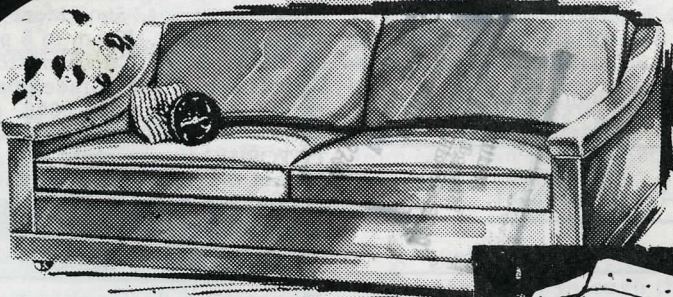
