KIWANIS BREAKFAST TOPPED 1969

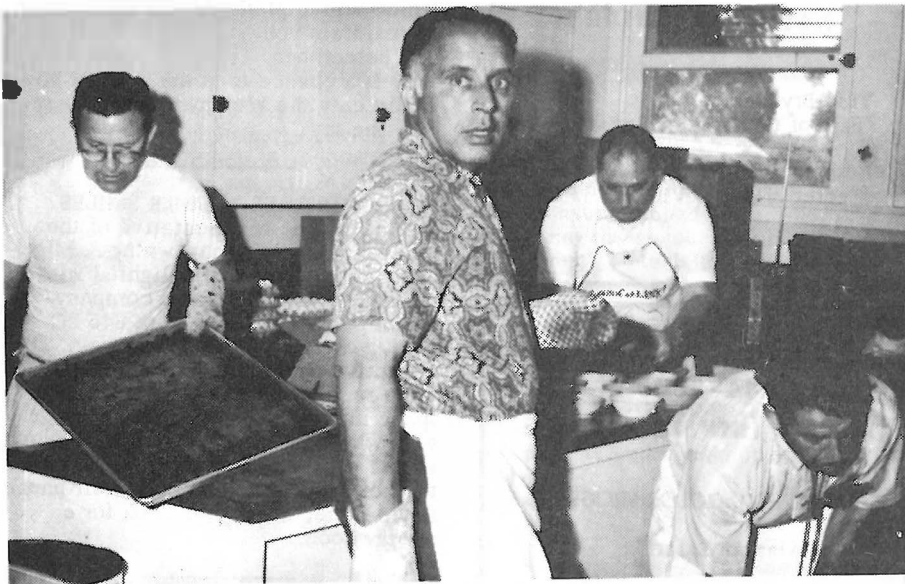

PROMOTES AID TO INJURED PETS

Guy V. Ryan, executive director of Mercy Crusade, Inc., SD Branch, and a state humane officer, is back from Sacramento where he spoke on behalf of the Crusade's bill calling for immediate veterinary care for dogs and cats that are injured.

Sen. James Mills presented SB179, says Ryan, who lives on his ranch at the Crest which was unanimously approved by the Senate Health & Welfare Committee. Mills introduced Ryan who told the committee "passage of this bill is necessary to stop the cruelty in city and county pounds". It was introduced as an amendment to the penal code 597F.

"I've seen enough cruelty as a humane officer to last a lifetime and make me sick" declares Ryan, who says he has been to the SD City manager Hahn and also the council, protesting their pound's cruelty to injured animals.

"They refused to do anything, so this SB179 was needed to force them to give medical attention to injured pets. I told the committee I have documentary proof that dogs lie for days in the city pound badly injured without any vet care, yet they had a surplus of \$35,000 in 1968 which they put into the general fund. This should have been used to care of these poor injured animals".

He says "collecting taxes for dogs then failing to care for them when injured in the streets is cruel and heartless and I'm thankful for the bill. Jack Schrade and Tom Hom said that they would support the bill so I hope it is passed by the House".

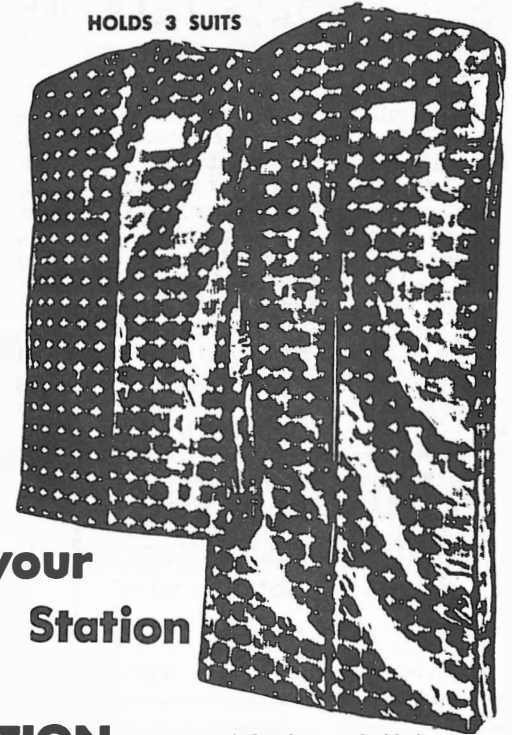
"Be quiet, stupid," his mother replied. "We're almost to the draft board."

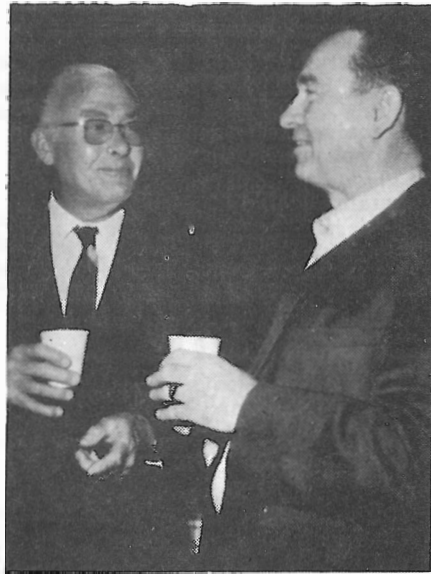

HOSS SENSE

This week I am going to give a little information on bot flies that are quite troublesome to your horse. With a little attention, they can be eliminated. They are the bee-like fly that has a pointed tail and you will find him laying eggs on your horse's legs, mane, chest and other places as they are not particular.

mules and donkeys but not any other farm animals. They damage the walls of the stomach and intestines and measures should be taken to remove them. There are 3 kinds, nose, throat and the common horse botfly.

Nose botflies attach their eggs to the hairs on a horse's lips and when the eggs hatch, enter the mouth. Throat flies lay eggs on the underjaw until hatching. The common bot lays its eggs on the horse's body and legs. The animal then licks the eggs, causing them to emerge and stick to the tongue.

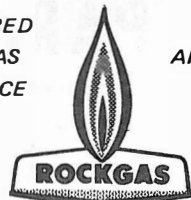
All three enter the mouth and burrow into the lining, gums or tongue. After a month, they pass to the stomach and intestines where they remain for 8 to 11 months, growing to about an inch. They can do serious damage before they are expelled. On the ground they become pupae and later hatch as flies.

Adult botflies have no mouth and since they don't eat cannot be lured into traps, nor is there any practicable way to kill the eggs. The best method is to have your vet come and worm your horse. Don't feed the evening or morning meal. Medication is given through a stomach tube or with a baling gun. As a rule a single dose is enough and the bots may continue to pass out for a month or more. You will be amazed at the amount of eggs if you look after the worming has been done for a few days.

It is best to worm during the winter months but if he hasn't had attention anytime is ok. You will find your horse will eat and look better after he has been freed from these intestinal parasites.
