**EDITORIAL**

**DO BROKEN HOMES PROMOTE ABORTION RISE?**

In the last few years there has been an upturn in abortions not only because this subject receives more publicity, but because many states have eased the stringent laws against it.

In this state they passed a law in 1967 legalizing it on certain grounds; rape, incest, statutory rape, health and mental health. Just in the last 6 months there has been much publicity on it.

The Abortion Counseling Service of SD, (PO Box 9199, SD, 92109), even has a newsletter on the topic. It tells of the national view of abortion laws and how nine states have "liberalized" laws much like California, except they allow additional grounds of fetal deformity.

In the past there have been too many women die because they could not go to a good doctor so had to hire a butcher! Or go out of the US. There is a national association for the repeal of abortion laws, and there is a Clergy

Counseling Service for Problem Pregnancies! Even the AMA has relaxed its position on this operation.

Recently there was an abortion symposium at UCSD here. Abortion is far more dangerous than one would suspect, as outlined at the session by Dr. Joseph Didio, who unfortunately met a tragic death with his family in a private airplane crash recently at Lake Tahoe. He showed that complications occur in 5.5% of all such operations, which is increased if pregnancy is over 12 weeks along. Loss of blood is the main worry.

Now, what, outside of legal reasons are the causes of abortion? One might cite the increase in sex attitudes due to today's run of salacious movies, TV, plays, books, radio and--female dress, plus the broken home when young people are not guided in the right path.

There is no doubt about it, the world and this country are having a spell of moral decadence, permissiveness and wanton disregard of high religious and spiritual standards which make for the higher type of life. See editorial for July 10, which has a bearing on this topic. If we have fewer broken homes we would have fewer broken girls! -CI.

In the group were Dawn Brooks, Kurt Wetzstein, Bob & Sean Newton, Donley Wilson, Helen Ellsberg and granddaughter Helen, Elizabeth & Vickie Owen, and Mrs. West.

"This is not a park or playground" says Mrs. West, an enthusiastic lover of the great outdoors, "but a real wildlife haven, something unique in SD County.

It is a place where all wild creatures even rattlesnakes, bobcats, and all wild plants, even poison oak are living together in their native habitat, she explains, "a place where we are privileged to watch them, learn from them, and enjoy them. This is what makes Silverwood so different from a park".

Frank Gander, resident naturalist, conducts nature walks on Sunday, 10 a. m. & 1:30 p. m. It is open to visitors on Wednesday, 9 to 4, by special arrangement on other days.

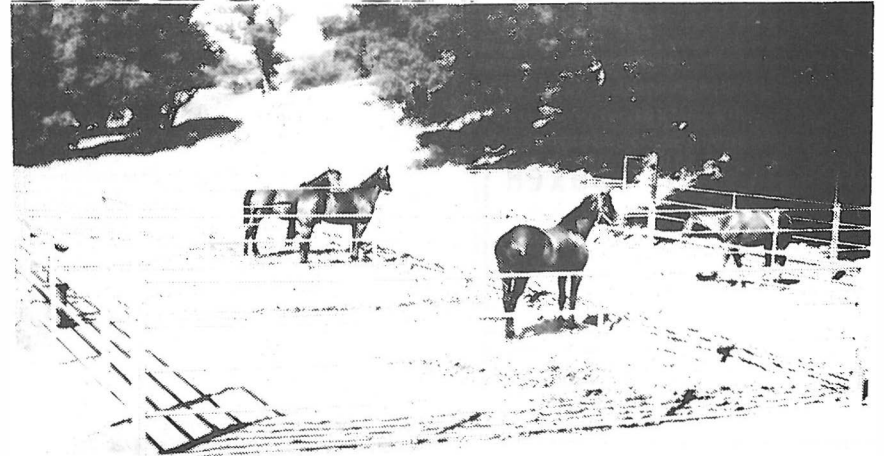

We haven't any definite news from Alpine Riding Club but as many members or prospective members are on vacation, will wait till later on in August.

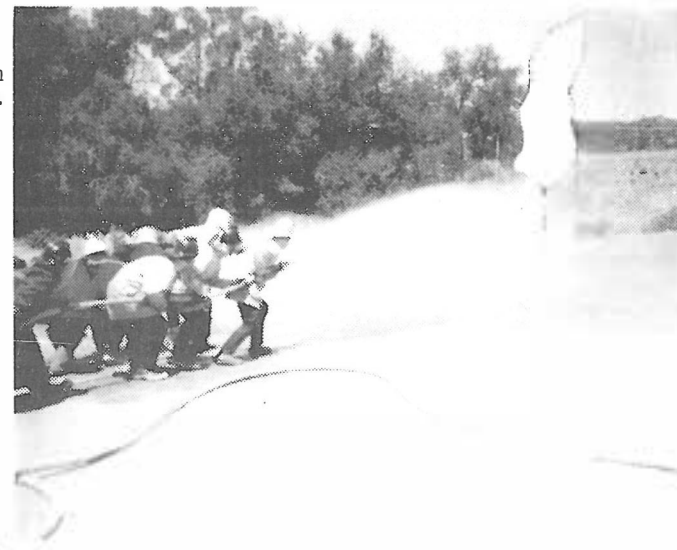

## ANCIENT BELL RINGING AGAIN

The old bell in the steeple of Community Church is ringing again on Sunday mornings calling the faithful to worship. The frayed and torn rope that for several years had prevented its ringing was replaced with a new one by two stalwart members of the volunteer Fire Department, aided by Al Haines.

Probably there is no one in the countryside who remembers the time in the past when the bell clanged the fire alarm which brought out the bucket brigade. So it seems only fitting that Dale Bennett, fire chief, and Dwayne Cracola, assistant, should use the longest ladder in the community and service the bell so that once again its tones can send a message over the countryside.

The bell is linked to the past of Alpine. It was brought here in 1898 and placed in the front cupola at the Town Hall. In addition to clanging the fire alarm it called people to town meetings, elections and church on Sunday, pealed gaily for weddings and in somber tones for funerals.

Later the Woman's Club bought the Town Hall. Among some changes made to convert the building to a clubhouse the cupola was removed. In 1932 the club gave the bell to the "Little Church in the Hills" that was being built across the street by the United Church of Christ. In 1952 the little church was moved to the back of the lot and the present Community Church constructed on the site.

Once again on Sunday mornings the bell in the steeple rings out a message that belongs to no one denomination. The clean mountain air carries the message. "There are churches where one may go to contemplate, and to worship God; where one may find a spiritual basis for living in the world today."

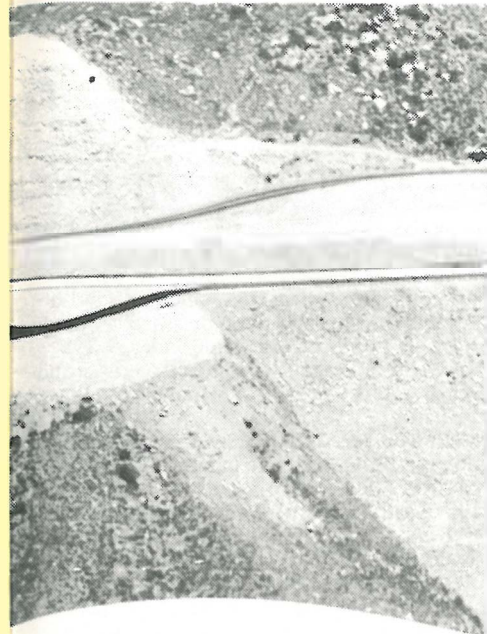

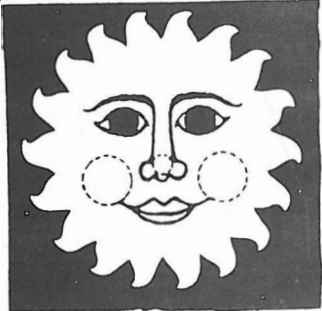

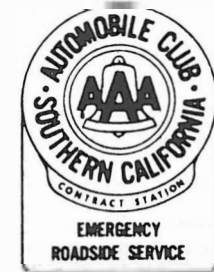

The gestation period of a mare is about 11 months, some will go under but most will go over a few days. It is a good idea to keep watch from 10 months on. If your mare is far out on pasture it would be a good idea to bring her closer to home if it is possible. It

is fine for a mare to foal on a pasture, a stall is not necessary. Either one is actually ok. If the weather is damp and cold a stall would be better but make plans ahead if possible and bring her in if conditions warrant it.

If your mare is left on pasture when the time is close you should check her at least once



a day and even twice to make sure everything is allright. In case of trouble with foaling you will be able to get help. You can tell foaling time by several things. The mare's bag will enlarge and become firm. Later, a waxy substance will form on the teats. The wax is to prevent any germs from getting on them before the colt nurses.

As she approaches first stages of labor the pelvic muscles will relax, making both sides of the tail head look sunken in. When actual labor begins she will become quite restless and lie down and get up several times. Sometimes they will sweat and become nervous.

The next thing is the breaking of the water bag, and after this the colt should arrive within 30 minutes, if not call the vet. Normally the colt's feet will come first followed by the head tucked between the knees. Any other way means trouble and you should call the vet right away. Don't try to do anything yourself because you could lose the foal or the mare or even both.

Keep a close eye on the mare after foaling to make sure she expels all of the afterbirth. This should occur within one to six hours.

If your mare is going to foal in a stall make sure the bedding is clean and well padded with fresh straw.

August, artists are busy preparing for the coming season in art work, and the show is one that everyone should make special effort to see.

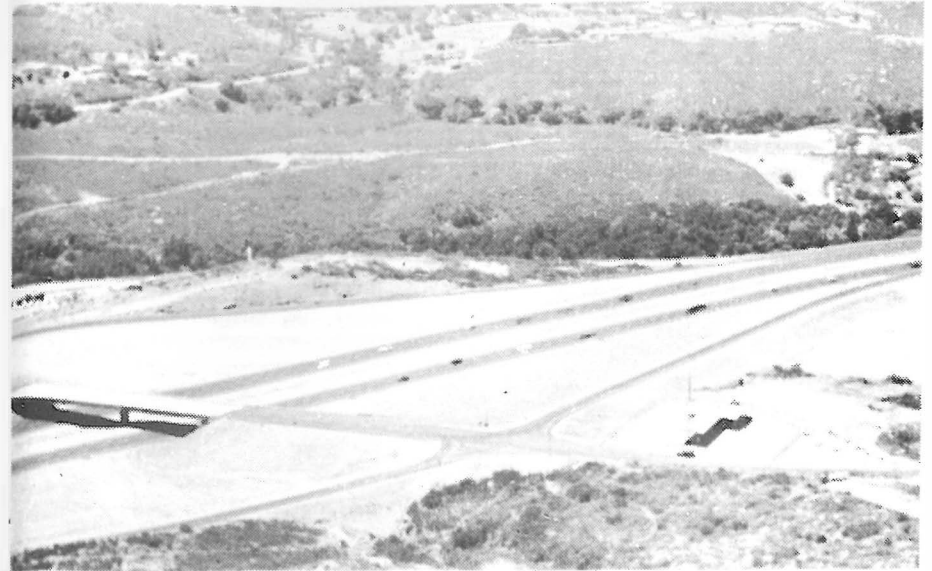
A sculpture by Byron Rodarmel, teacher at the Chalet, is one example of what can happen if one just lets go. The sculpture, encased in resin, has the happy accident of a thread, running in uniformity and design, around the head of the sculpture. The effect is one of surprise and adds strength to the work.

One artist in conjunction with the expert help of John Titus, outgoing president, and owner of the Chalet, is experimenting in unusual framing effects. The frame, rustic in design, will consist of two manzanita branches, small in diameter, glued to a 2" piece of wood. One piece at each end, and one in the middle. Each end of the frame will be tied with a leather thong, enhancing the rustic effect, and the colors in the manzanita bringing out them in the painting.

This is the second of unusual framing effects as conglomerated by the artist and Mr. Titus, and shows what can be done with a little imagination.
