BIG DEVELOPMENT STARTS SOON

About 190 fine homes costing from \$40 to \$50,000 with a small lake, swimming pool and tennis courts are in the program of National Pacific Development Co., for 1140 acres in Blossom Valley below town.

This is the land once owned by the Ed Fletcher Co., which the firm acquired early this year. They won county planning okay for the minimum 2½ acre lots and a 10-ft easement around property lines for riding trails.

The area lies between Oak Creek Road on the north of Old Hwy 80 and Hawley Road. Work should begin within three months if supervisors approve. The project will be named Los Coches Hills. Allotted for school are 10 acres, four for business offices, and storage buildings. It indicates what is moving toward Alpine!

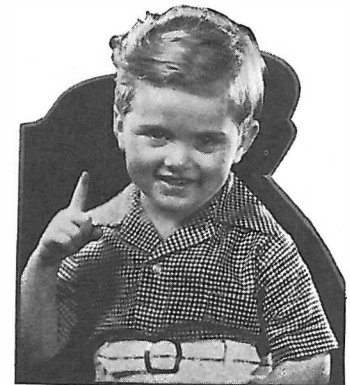

The nation thinks of SD County in terms of sunshine, fine climate, progress and gracious western living. But how can progress come if we still have to use old methods for disposing of all waste material.

Money should be allotted for some scientific way of handling sewage in the country.

HERE'S ONE TAX THAT'S LOWER!

While property taxes are going up, water taxes are seeking their own level, one might say, for Rio SD MWD reveals that the improvement district, which includes Alpine, the 1970-71 rate will be \$1.75, a drop of 20¢. In 1962-63 when it was first levied it was \$2.38, has dropped steadily. It said the cuts were due "to prudent management and the growth of the district's assessed valuation"

Directors have adopted a general district budget of \$383,750, compared with \$299,152 for 1969-70, and an improvement district budget of \$193,175, contrasted with \$145,600 for last fiscal year.

Increases in the budget are due to a rise in the wholesale cost of water, which has gone up \$4 an acre-foot in the last fiscal year, and other inflationary pressures.

All boxes must have printed on the right side the last name of the individuals receiving mail at that address. They must have printed on the right side the Street Address of the postal patron regardless of the location of the box.

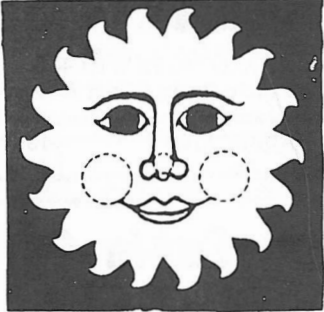

6 weeks before any skin lesions develop.

Mange will spread quickly over the skin. Early signs appear on the head, neck and shoulders. Areas protected by long hair and the lower parts are usually not involved. This is one form called sarcoptic mange.

Your first warning will be intense itching. Sores and scales will appear and later on will form crusts. The bald patches will enlarge especially in the neck region.

Another form is psoroptic which will occur on the opposite area as the first mentioned. The legs and areas with long hair will be affected. This type will be large and thicker but with less itching.

Another type of leg mange will occur mostly in the summer weather and will seem to go away during the cooler winter months and then return again in the summer.

Mange can be treated by isolation and sterilizing all equipment and stalls, water and feed tubs, etc. The horse can be dipped or sprayed. There are several things you can get for spraying, but it usually takes several treatments. You should call your vet and he can give you the proper thing to treat the sores with and to help clear it up.

Animals are usually dipped four to six times at intervals of 10-12 days. Dipping is easiest for groups of infested animals but if you just have one or two horses, the spray or rubbing method would be best.

This is one disease you should not let go and your horse will thank you when he is free of this.

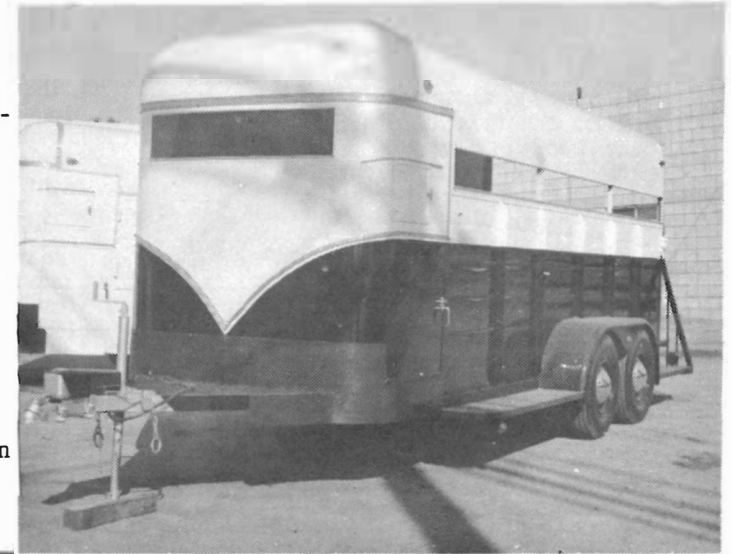

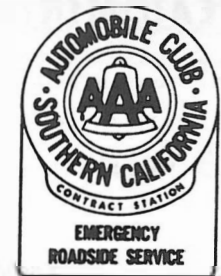

CLAUDE BAILEY SCORES A SCOOP

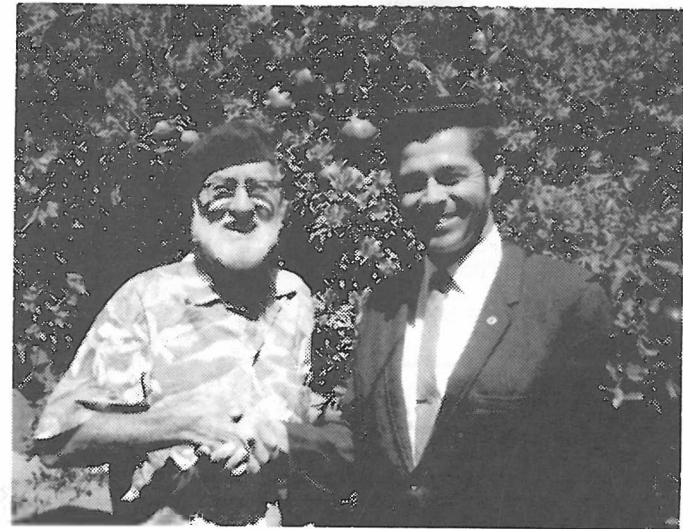
