





I'VE JUST LOOKED at my calendar, and realized with something of a shock, that after the festive holidays we've just been through, there is a long, dreary stretch till the next day of celebration, which is Lincoln's birthday in some quarters, and Washington's, generally observed by everyone. And it is my opinion that this is much too long a period to wait for a day off.

I SHOULD LIKE to start a crusade for more holidays. You have no idea how many we could set aside if we really wanted to. One very good idea would be to observe all the president's birthdays instead of just a favored few. We'd have three of these in January — Millard Fillmore's on the seventh, William McKinley's on the twenty-ninth and FDR's, of course, on the thirtieth. There is a nice set-up — two days in a row! February is already taken care of but we should add William Henry Harrison on the ninth. And then in March Andrew Jackson was born on March 15th, James Madison on the 16th, and there's another lovely double holiday! Grover Cleveland on the eighteenth, and John Tyler on March twenty-ninth. This is getting better and better.

IN APRIL THOMAS Jefferson was born on the thirteenth and James Buchanan on the twenty-third, along with Ulysses Grant's natal day which is the twenty-seventh. That's all for April, Harry Truman was born May 8th, and John F. Kennedy May 29th strictly a Democratic month, but who cares! In June, regrettably, no presidents were born,

but we could celebrate July 4th doubly, be-cause Calvin Coolidge was born on Inde-pendence Day and John Quincy Adams on the eleventh.

IN JULY WE have three birthdays, Herbert Hoover on the tenth, Benjamin Harrison on the twentieth and LBJ's on the twentyseventh. September has just one, William Howard Taft on the fifteenth and there are five in October - Rutherford B. Hayes, Chester Alan Arthur— and if you don't know who they were, shame on you! I think you will remember Dwight D. Eisenhower — he was born on October fourteenth. Theodore Roosevelt and John Adams were born on October twenty-seventh and thirtieth, respectively.

THERE ARE FIVE more in November, James Knox on the second, Warren Harding's also the second, so you could celebrate either one - James Garfield the nineteenth, Franklin Pierce the twenty-third - along with Thanksgiving Day — another double — and Zachary Taylor on the twenty-fourth we should get an extra day for that. December winds up with Martin Van Buren on the fifth, Woodrow Wilson the twenty-eighth and Andrew Johnson's the twenty-ninth.

I MUST ADMIT the presidents should have had enough foresight to scatter their natal days a bit more - even distribution would have helped, but I think I shall submit my proposal to the Great Society and see what comes of it. If this goes well, I may check up on the vice-presidents too!
