




As the Cedar fire advanced toward Descanso, horse owners watched and worried.









The following days


"ulian had survived, but Steven Rucker, a Novato firefighter defending the historic mountain town, died. The remaining days of the Cedar and Paradise fires were filled with triumphs and sadness. Firefighters' efforts moved from defending structures to defeating the fire, but they paused to remember their fallen comrade. And, with the Paradise fire still burning, Ashleigh Roach was memorialized by the Valley Center firefighters she had befriended. With the fires nearing containment, communities began to turn their focus to recovery and rebuilding.












